PM Modi To Launch Projects Worth ₹37,000 Crore In Northeast During Visit

(Gns). Prime Minister Narendra Modi will travel to Mizoram, Manipur, and Assam on September 13 and 14 to launch development projects worth over ₹34,830 crore, including the Bairabi-Sairang New Rail Line in Mizoram, and the Assam Bio-ethanol Private Limited and Numaligarh Refinery Plant in Assam.

In a post on 'X' on Friday, Modi wrote, "Over the next few days, on 13th, 14th, and 15th September, I will be attending programmes in Mizoram, Manipur, Assam, West Bengal and Bihar aimed at boosting 'Ease of Living.' These projects will have a very positive impact on people's lives, especially towards boosting connectivity, job creation and more."

Prime Minister Narendra

Modi will visit Mizoram, Manipur, and Assam on September 13 and 14 to launch development projects worth over ₹34,830 crore, including the Bairabi-Sairang New Rail Line in Mizoram, and the Assam Bio-ethanol Private Limited and Numaligarh Refinery Plant in Assam.

According to the Prime Minister's Office, Modi will begin his visit in Aizawl, Mizoram, on September 13, where he will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of projects worth over ₹9,000 crore. Among them

is the Bairabi-Sairang New Rail Line, which will connect the state capital to the Indian Railways network for the first time.

Later that day, the Prime Minister will be in Churachandpur, Manipur, to launch projects valued at over ₹7,300 crore, followed by an event in Imphal where he will inaugurate projects worth more than ₹1,200 crore.

On September 14, Modi will travel to Assam to inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of projects worth over ₹18,530 crore, includ-

ing the Assam Bio-ethanol Private Limited and the Numaligarh Refinery Plant in Golaghat.

Landmark Projects in the Northeast Under Modi Government

Since coming to power, the Modi government has emphasized development in the northeast, describing the region as India's "gateway to Southeast Asia."

In March last year, Modi inaugurated the Sela Tunnel in Arunachal Pradesh, the world's longest bi-lane tunnel at 13,000 feet. Built by the Border Roads Organisation at a cost of ₹825 crore, the tunnel links Arunachal's Tawang with Assam's Tezpur.

FM Nirmala Sitharaman to visit Ayodhya on October 8

A grand programme will be organised on the occasion of the inauguration, during which local people and visiting guests will be shown a glimpse of Ayodhya's culture.

Ayodhya District Magistrate Nikhil T Funde has appealed to the local people to help keep

Ayodhya clean and beautiful. He said there is a need to organise the Teedi Bazaar intersection, which is being beautified. The progress of ongoing work at Brihaspati Kund was reviewed, and instructions were issued to complete the minor construction work on time.

Punjab CM announces to make all flood affected villages free from silt and debris in 10 days

(Gns). Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Saturday announced to embark Mega Rehabilitation and Cleanliness Drive worth Rs 100 crore in Flood-Affected Areas across the state.

Interacting with the media persons, the Chief Minister said that as Floodwaters have now receded from many areas, but a large amount of silt and dirt still remains across villages and towns. He said that to restore normal life, it is essential to clean these areas for which the state government is launching a mega cleanliness drive in all 2,300 affected villages and wards. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that every village, the state government has constituted teams with JCB machines, tractor-trolleys, and labor adding that these teams will remove silt and debris from each village and carry out complete cleaning drive.

The Chief Minister apprehended that as several animals have also lost their lives so these teams will properly dispose off them, after which cleaning, fogging will be carried out

in every village to ensure that the spread of diseases is checked. He said that the state government has allocated ₹100 crore for this entire campaign adding that out of this, ₹1 lakh is being released to every affected village as initial funds to start the work. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that any further requirements will also be covered from this fund adding that the state government will bear the full cost of cleaning.

Setting the deadline, the Chief Minister said that by September 24 all villages will be made silt and debris free by cleaning them and October 15 repair work at public places will be completed. Similarly he said that by October 22 the cleaning of ponds will be finished adding that The government has already made all the necessary arrangements. However, Bhagwant Singh Mann solicited the participation of NGOs, youth clubs, and other organizations in this noble cause Just as everyone had united and fought against this disaster togeth-

er. The Chief Minister said that Alongside, it is equally important to ensure that no disease spreads after the floods and that anyone with health-related problems



immediately receives medical care. For this purpose, he said that the state government will set up medical camps in all 2,303 flood-affected villages adding that In 596 villages, where Aam Aadmi Clinics already exist, medical camps, facilities, and medicines will be available there. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that in the remaining 1,707 villages, these medical camps will be set up at community spaces such as schools, dharamshalas, anganwadi centers, or panchayat buildings.

The Chief Minister said

that each camp will be equipped with doctors, medical staff, and medical facilities. He said that the state government has arranged 550 ambulances for this special campaign so that people in affected villages face no delay or difficulty in receiving medical service. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that as per reports so far, about 2.5 lakh animals across 713 villages have been affected by the floods and to prevent the spread of diseases among them, the government has launched a campaign to save them and support farmers.

The Chief Minister said that teams of Veterinary doctors' have been deployed in all villages and a special campaign is being run for the cleaning and disinfection of animals and their shelters. He said that Debris and spoiled fodder from animal shelters will be removed and Farmers will be provided potassium permanganate to disinfect fodder and water. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that by September 30 vaccination of all affected animals will be completed to prevent the spread of diseases.

JP Nadda holds key strategy meeting with Bihar BJP, slams Congress-RJD

BJP National President and Union Minister Jagat Prakash Nadda held a meeting with the Bihar BJP Core Committee in Patna on Saturday, attended by National General Secretary B L Santhosh and senior party leaders from Bihar.

The late-evening meeting, considered significant in view of the upcoming Assembly elections, saw discussions on a range of election-related issues, including the BJP's strategy for seat-sharing within the NDA.

The issue of seat-sharing within the NDA is becoming increasingly complex, with senior BJP leaders working to resolve the matter. Earlier, Union Home Minister Amit Shah had sought feedback from Bihar BJP leaders, and now

JP Nadda has followed up with consultations on the same issue.

In addition, the Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare visited Akhand Jyoti Eye Hospital in Chhapra to review its infrastructure, modern equipment, and healthcare services. He was accompanied by Bihar BJP President Dilip Jaiswal, Deputy Chief Minister Samrat Choudhary, and Bihar Health Minister Mangal Pandey.

Earlier in the day, while speaking at a media conclave, Nadda launched a sharp attack on the Opposition.

"Congress and the rest of the Opposition have

brought politics to its lowest level. Earlier, Modi ji's mother was abused on their platform, and the video released by Congress yesterday proves how dirty their mindset is," he said.

He added, "These people are degrading the standards of politics. The land of Bihar is witness to this. The awakened people of Bihar will give them a fitting reply at the right time."

Taking a swipe at Congress leader Rahul Gandhi over his criticism of the SIR (Special Intensive Revision) exercise, Nadda remarked: "Who knows where Rahul Gandhi gets his data from, or what kind of mathematics he uses?"

There's a saying in Hindi, 'Naach na jaane aangan tedha' (A bad workman blames his tools). Similarly, when they don't receive the people's support in elections, Congress and the entire Opposition blame the Election Commission."

Targeting the RJD, Nadda alleged that the party attempted to push Bihar into lawlessness and darkness.

"Back in 2003, there was an atmosphere of fear in Patna. An MLA was murdered in broad daylight, and the accused was a close aide of Lalu Prasad," he said.

Continuing his attack on the RJD supremo, Nadda said: "In the name of development, Lalu Prasad used to say, 'If we build roads, the police will reach faster, and animals' hooves will be damaged.'

Editorial

Constitutional Calm

India's vice-presidential election, though often overshadowed by larger political contests, has once again underscored the delicate balance between constitutional formality and political messaging. The elevation of CP Radhakrishnan, a seasoned political figure with deep roots in the ruling alliance, reflects both continuity and strategy at a moment of sudden transition. The vacancy was created by the abrupt resignation of Jagdeep Dhankhar, who cited health reasons for stepping down mid-term.

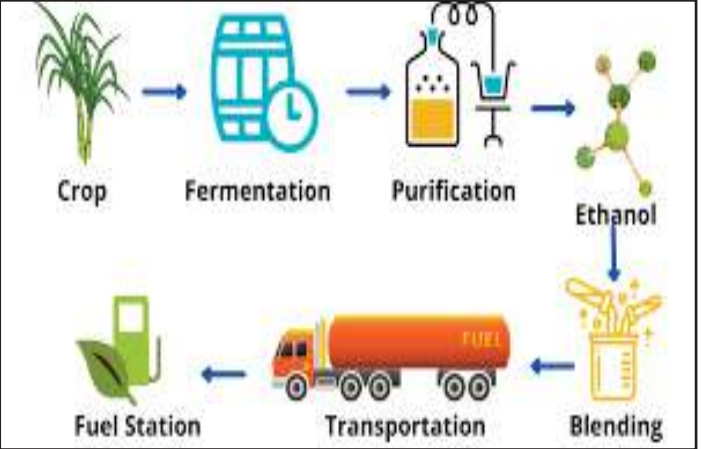
While speculation swirled about possible differences with the government, the official line remained one of prioritising well-being. In such moments of flux, the choice of successor becomes a litmus test not only of political strength but also of institutional stability. Mr Radhakrishnan's decisive victory over opposition-backed candidate, retired Justice Sudershan Reddy, reveals two things: the ruling alliance's continued parliamentary dominance and the opposition's struggle to mount a credible counterweight.

The numbers speak for themselves. Even accounting for invalid ballots, the support Mr Radhakrishnan secured shows a ruling coalition confident enough to press its advantage, while the opposition remains unable to expand its influence beyond symbolic candidacies. But this contest was not merely about numbers. The vice-presidency is the second-highest constitutional office in the country, carrying the responsibility of presiding over the Rajya Sabha and ensuring that parliamentary deliberations remain rooted in decorum and fairness. In an era of fractious debates, walkouts, and acrimonious disruptions, the personality of the chair matters as much as the letter of the rules.

Mr Radhakrishnan's reputation for affability and ability to work across political lines will be closely watched in this regard. If he can command the respect of both government and opposition benches, he may help restore some dignity to proceedings that too often descend into unproductive theatre. His background also carries significance. A two-time MP from Coimbatore and a former state party president, Mr Radhakrishnan embodies the trajectory of a grassroots political worker rising through organisational ranks. His early association with ideological training grounds has been matched by a practical record of electoral battles and committee work.

This blend of ideological commitment and pragmatic experience makes him a loyalist who can still navigate complexity ~ a profile well suited for a role that demands neutrality without naivety. The broader message from this midterm election is one of stability. At a time when India is preparing for crucial economic and foreign policy challenges, constitutional continuity reassures both domestic and global audiences. Yet stability should not be mistaken for stagnation. The Vice-President's chair is not ornamental; it is an active institution that can either elevate parliamentary culture or allow it to wither further. The responsibility now rests on Mr Radhakrishnan to prove that this transition is not just about filling a vacancy but about reinforcing the spirit of India's democracy. His tenure will be judged not only by the government that elevated him but by the millions of citizens who expect institutions to rise above partisanship

Unseen Costs of Ethanol Blending:



This month, the Supreme Court dismissed a petition that argued Indian consumers should be given a choice between regular petrol and 20 per cent ethanol-blended petrol (E20). The government claimed the move benefits sugarcane farmers. But what about the millions of drivers whose cars and two-wheelers cannot handle it? Once again, consumers are left out of the equation. Realistically E20 may be good in the long run, but India rushed ahead without giving motorists the freedom to choose.

For anyone driving a vehicle made before April 2023, filling up with E20 is not just inconvenient; it could damage engines, reduce mileage, and increase maintenance costs. Imagine a middle class family still paying off a scooter bought in 2020, suddenly being told their fuel could corrode the engine. That is not an upgrade, it is an unfair burden. The bigger problem is that India seems to have a habit of introducing reforms that lo ok farmer- or climate-friendly on paper but come at the expense of consumer choice. Take the recent push for electric vehicles.

Charging infrastructure is still patchy, yet subsidies and regulations nudge buy-

ers toward EVs even when reliable alternatives are scarce. Or look at renewable energy; consumers face higher power tariffs while being told it is for the "greater good." The E20 roll-out fits this pattern ~ policy first, consumer later. Contrast this with how other countries manage fuel transitions. In the United States, E10 fuel (10 per cent ethanol) has been the standard for years, but E15 and higher blends are optional, not mandatory. Fuel stations clearly label pumps, and motorists can decide what goes into their tank.

Brazil, the poster child of ethanol policy, provides both pure petrol and ethanol blends, leaving the final decision to consumers. That's the crucial difference, the choice. India skipped that step. No parallel supply of E10. No labeling at pumps. No consumer education campaign. Just a blanket rollout of E20. The message is clear, the state decides, and motorists must comply. That is not how policy in a growing democracy should work. Supporters of the move argue that higher ethanol use supports sugarcane farmers and reduces oil imports. True. But the costs are being shifted onto ordinary people.

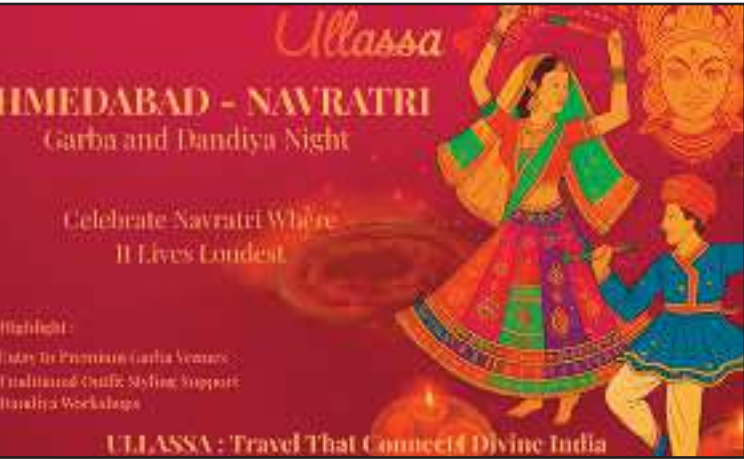

That would be like trying to push the world back to the middle ages. This is just as unfortunate as the stance taken by some regarding climate change. They say that the best solution is to kill half the world's population in order to take the Earth back to its former state. In fact, closing borders cannot solve the problem of immigration. The solution lies in the just and thoughtful use of a nation's total resources.

Another thing that has become clear from the March for Australia rallies is that multiculturalism itself is being questioned worldwide today. Theorists often ask whether, despite its theoretical correctness, multiculturalism has failed in practical application. Even if we admit that multiculturalism has not been entirely successful across the globe, it must also be said that till date no alternative policy has been found that is as acceptable as multiculturalism. For all its flaws and incompleteness, multiculturalism remains the philosophy that promotes mutual respect and harmony among communities.

It teaches us to respect diversity without breeding separatism. The alternative to multiculturalism cannot, by any means, be rabid nationalism. Extreme nationalism, in the final analysis, is suicidal. Therefore, multicultural countries must strive to translate the ideals of multiculturalism ~ equality and mutual respect ~ into policy in such a way that no community feels it is being treated unfairly. Needless to say, at the same time political leaders must adopt a firm stance against every kind of neo-Nazism. The world cannot be allowed to walk backward again.

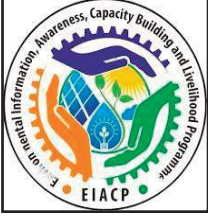
