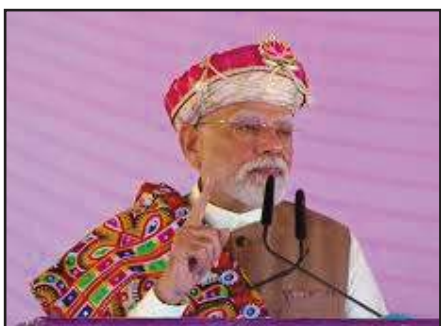
PM Modi said that Pakistani terrorist's recent

PM Modi vowed that "new India fears no nuclear threats, it strikes terrorists in their homes."

"The nation gives utmost priority to the security of Mother India. Pakistani terrorists removed the Sindoor of our sisters and daughters. We did Operation Sindoor and destroyed terror camps. Our brave armed forces brought Pakistan to its knees within the blink of an eye. Just yesterday, the nation and the world witnessed another Pakistani

terrorist tearfully narrate his ordeal. This is a new India. It fears no one's nuclear threats," he said.



September 17 holds historic significance, he said, referring to 17th September 1948, the day on which the Indian Army launched Operation Polo and brought Hyderabad State under the Indian Union.

On this day, Sardar Patel's unwavering deter-

mination was witnessed as the Indian Army liberated Hyderabad and safeguarded its rightful place in the nation, he said. "For decades, this milestone went unrecognised, but our government ensured its legacy endures by officially commemorating it as Hyderabad Liberation Day," he stated.

Announcing the launch of the 'Swasth Nari, Sashakt Parivar' campaign he said, "We must make a firm resolve. Friends, the health of mothers, sisters and daughters is our priority. Our government is working in mission mode for the nutrition of pregnant women and daughters. From today, we begin the 8th National Nutrition Month".

India doesn't take dictation from anyone; it writes its own script: Rajnath

(Gns). Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Wednesday asserted that Operation Sindoor, 2016 surgical strike, and 2019 Balakot air strike are a proof that India's patience is its strength, not weakness.

He also said that India rejected third party intervention in the ceasefire during Operation Sindoor as no outside player can interfere in India's internal matters. "Today, India does not take dictation from anyone; it writes its own script," he said.

The minister was speaking at the Hyderabad Liberation Day event, organized in Hyderabad,

Telangana, on Wednesday. Asserting that while the strong and resolute 'New India' believes in dialogue, Singh said that it knows how to give a befitting reply to those who fail to understand the language of peace and goodwill. "India chooses the path of hard power when negotiations fail to yield any solution," he said.

"While terrorists killed innocent citizens in Pahalgam based on their dharma, the Indian Armed Forces killed terrorists and destroyed their hideouts in Pakistan and Pakistan

Occupied Kashmir (PoK) during Operation Sindoor based on their karma," he added.

Crediting the valour and dedication of the Armed Forces for the successful execution, he reiterated that the operation is only on hold, and it will resume in full force in case another terrorist activity is orchestrated from across the border.

The Union minister also hailed the role of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel as 'Iron man' in uniting North and South India. Singh also commended the courage of

those who participated in Operation Polo, stating that it was not merely a military operation; it was Sardar Patel's decisive blow that shattered the Razakars' conspiracy and brought Hyderabad back to India.

He termed the success of Operation Polo and the merger of Hyderabad with India as a glorious chapter which demonstrated to the world that India has always been both capable and powerful in protecting its unity.

AAP's Saurabh Bharadwaj Challenges Suryakumar Yadav Over Pahalgam Tribute

(Gns). India's thrilling seven-wicket victory over Pakistan in the Asia Cup should have been remembered purely for cricket. But the post-match dedication by skipper Suryakumar Yadav has sparked a political storm.

Moments after the win, Yadav said the triumph was for the victims of the Pahalgam terror attack—a gesture that drew applause from some quarters but sharp criticism from AAP leader Saurabh Bharadwaj.

Following India's seven-wicket win against Pakistan in the Asia Cup, Suryakumar Yadav dedicated the victory to the victims of the Pahalgam terror

attack, drawing both praise and criticism, including a challenge from AAP leader Saurabh Bharadwaj regarding financial contributions.

Bharadwaj wasn't impressed. At a press briefing, he dismissed the dedication as hollow. "If you, the BCCI, and the ICC really have courage, donate your earnings from broadcasting rights and advertisements to the 26 widows of Pahalgam. Only then will we believe your words," he challenged.

Beyond the Cricket Field

The game itself wasn't free from drama. Players from both sides skipped the traditional handshake. Even at the toss, Yadav and Pakistan's Salman Ali

Agha avoided the courtesy. After the match, Yadav and Shivam Dube headed straight to the dressing room while the Pakistani squad lingered on the field.

This tension played out against the backdrop of heated calls for India to boycott sporting ties with Pakistan after the April 22 attack in Pahalgam that killed 26 civilians. The

government allowed the match to proceed, with Union minister Manohar Lal insisting that cricket and security issues must remain separate.

Bharadwaj doubled down, accusing Yadav and cricket authorities of empty symbolism. "It is embarrassing to make such false claims of dedication without real contribution," he said.

For now, neither Yadav nor cricketing bodies like the BCCI or ICC have responded. But the controversy underscores how cricket between India and Pakistan often carries stakes that go far beyond the scoreboard—where every word, or gesture, is open to political scrutiny.

Nitish Kumar Announces Interest-Free Education Loans Under Bihar Student Credit Card Scheme

(Gns). Chief Minister Nitish Kumar has announced a major reform in the Bihar Student Credit Card Scheme (BSCCS), a flagship initiative launched in 2016 under the "Saat Nischay Yojana." Ahead of the Assembly elections, the scheme has been made more student-friendly, offering interest-free loans to all students pursuing higher education.

Until now, general applicants paid 4% interest on loans, while women, differently-abled, and transgender students were charged 1%. With the latest decision, the interest rate has been reduced to zero for everyone, enabling students to

borrow up to ₹4 lakh without financial stress.

Bihar's Chief Minister Nitish Kumar announced reforms to the Bihar Student Credit Card Scheme (BSCCS), originally launched in 2016, making interest-free loans available to all students for higher education, up to ₹4 lakh, along with extended repayment periods of up to 10 years.

The repayment window has also been extended to ease the burden on graduates. For loans up to ₹2

lakh, students will now get 7 years (84 EMIs) instead of 5 years. For loans above ₹2 lakh, the repayment period has been increased to 10 years (120 EMIs), compared to the earlier 7 years.

Sharing the update on social media, Nitish Kumar said, "No student in Bihar should be deprived of higher education due to lack of money. This decision will boost their confidence and allow them to study with full dedication."

The Chief Minister emphasized that the reform would not only uplift students but also contribute to the development of Bihar and the nation. The scheme, which has supported thousands of families since its launch on 2 October 2016, is aimed at improving college enrollment rates and nurturing young talent from economically weaker backgrounds.

With these sweeping changes, the state government hopes to remove financial barriers to higher education, ensuring that more students pursue their academic aspirations and contribute to Bihar's growth story.

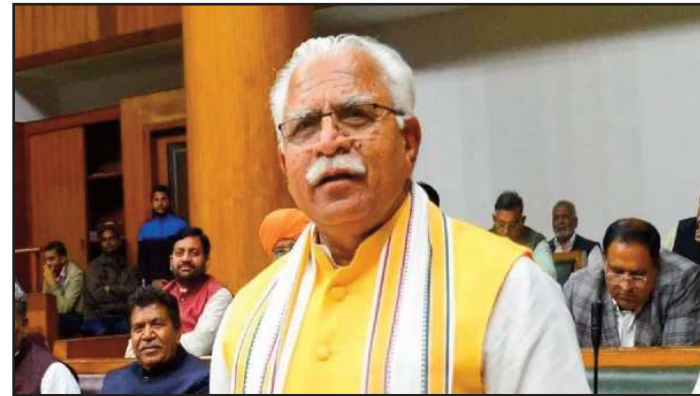

Astronomical Competition

The sudden exclusion of Chinese nationals from America's National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) is more than an administrative directive. It is the clearest signal yet that the contest for dominance beyond Earth has entered a new and more combative phase. Space, once heralded as a realm for cooperative exploration, is now treated as a strategic frontier where access, data, and talent are guarded as tightly as any terrestrial military base.

For decades, the pursuit of science was supposed to rise above national rivalry. American and Soviet astronauts once shook hands in orbit; this was at the height of the Cold War. But the latest restrictions underscore how dramatically that ideal has eroded. By cutting off Chinese researchers, Washington is not merely responding to espionage fears; it is acknowledging that the next breakthroughs in propulsion, robotics, and resource extraction carry direct implications for economic and military power. Control of the Moon's mineral wealth or the ability to station assets in lunar orbit could shape technological advantages for generations.

China's rapid ascent in space exploration has sharpened these anxieties. It has landed probes on the far side of the Moon, built its own orbital station, and signalled an ambition to place crews on the lunar surface within the decade. The United States, long the unchallenged leader in human spaceflight, now faces a competitor with both political will and industrial capacity. For American lawmakers, ensuring that the first flags planted on future lunar mining sites are stars and stripes rather than five golden stars is more than symbolism ~ it is a strategic imperative.

The human cost of this geopolitical turn is considerable. Young scientists who once imagined space research as a universal pursuit now confront closed doors and revoked access, regardless of individual intent or talent. Scientific progress thrives on collaboration, and isolating a fifth of the world's population will inevitably slow the exchange of ideas. The very technologies that could help humanity manage climate change, harness new energy sources, or establish off-planet habitats risk being developed behind national firewalls. Yet this shift may also galvanise innovation. Competition has historically propelled daring missions, and a renewed race could accelerate breakthroughs in propulsion, habitat design, and planetary defence.

But speed achieved through rivalry is not the same as progress achieved through cooperation. Without shared protocols, the scramble for lunar resources could invite conflict, turning a once-aspirational frontier into another contested domain. The decision to tighten borders around space research is, therefore, a double-edged policy. It may protect critical technology in the short term, but it also hardens the very divisions that make the cosmos a battlefield in waiting. Humanity stands to gain immeasurably from the stars; whether it does so together or apart will define the next era

It is important to take care of your skin and hair during this time, to elevate your looks and enhance your confidence.

Women of all age groups find the festival fascinating and there is no stopping them as they groove to the latest Navratri songs. However, the long, tiring hours and makeup is dulling your skin. The constant sweat and pollution which the skin is exposed to during the long hours outside homes needs to be dealt with carefully. It is time for the female folk to indulge in skincare rituals for flawless, radiant skin and to look totally stunning.

While you might be ready to indulge in the festivities, are your skin & hair ready too?

It is an opportunity to be at your attractive best in a traditional way in the evening when the weather is cooling down .Apart from the religious significance, the nine days festival is perfect time to get your jewellery, makeup ,accessories and traditional outfits ready for Navratri .

Since this is also a chance to meet new people, it is the best time to showcase your beauty sense and dancing prowess.

So here are some quick fixes for you to start gearing up for skin, hair make up to look gorgeous and attractive even before the festival begins.

Your skin is called the mirror of your body .During festivals like Navratri, there are bright lights. So, for your night make-up, you will need bright colours, otherwise your face will look pale.

First, cleanse the skin and apply a liquid moisturizer. For oily skin, apply an astringent lotion with cotton

wool.

Wait for a few minutes. Then, cover blemishes with a concealer, before applying foundation. Or, use a lighter colour foundation on dark blemishes and then apply normal foundation on the entire face. If you wish to cover a pimple or spot, it should be done before applying foundation or powder. Concealing sticks are available for this. Using a thin brush, paint over the spot with a little concealer, or lighter shade of foundation. Then, apply a little powder.

Dot foundation on the face and blend with a damp sponge or with finger tips. Don't forget the neck. Apply loose powder, or try compact powder to set the foundation. Use foundation with beige tones, rather than pink. I feel beige suits Indian skin colour better. If you have a very fair ivory skin, go for beige with a rosy tint. If the complexion is fair, but pale (yellowish), avoid pink tones and go for beige or biscuit. Darker complexions look better with brownish beige. I feel that most Indian skin tones look better in beige or biscuit shades of foundation, rather than pink.

Or go for gold foundation for this special occasion. Dot the face with it and blend with a moist sponge, to give the skin a golden glow. When you apply make-up, remember not to smear too much or rub it. Whether it is foundation or blusher, it is best to dot it with a light touch, using a finger tip, or an applicator. It can also be applied lightly and evenly with a damp sponge.

Try tinted powders, like warm yellow tones of powder. Powder with a golden tint will also suit. It should be lightly applied. If you want a really healthy glow without the shine, go for a bronzing powder. Avoid applying too much. It should be lightly applied, using a big powder brush.

A hint of blusher should be used on the cheeks. A powder blusher is easier to apply. Use it after you have applied powder. Apply on the cheeks and blend it outwards and slightly upwards. Then, apply light coloured highlighter on the cheekbones. Blend well.

Blusher colours for the night need not match lip colour exactly, but it should be in the same colour tone. For example, if you have worn an orange lipstick, avoid pink blush on. For fair skin, try pinks and reds. If you have a yellowish skin, avoid orange. For wheat complexions, colours like rose, coral, copper are flattering, while plum, wine, bronze may suit darker complexions.

For eyes, apply lighter brown shadow on the upper eye lid and dark brown eye shadow in the crease, to add depth. Outline the eyes with dark eye pencil or eyeliner. For a smudged effect, a dark eye shadow also works well on the upper lid, close to the lashes. Extend it a little beyond the outer corner of the eyes, slightly upwards. Smudging can be done with a sponge tipped applicator. Eye liner or dark eye shadow may be applied on the lower lid and then smudged.

Actually, dramatic and heavy eye make-up, with the black eye-lined or winged eyed look has been the trend and is gaining in popularity. It will be ruling fashion trends. Go for dark eyeliner just under the lower lashes and on upper lid close to the lashes. Extend the lines on upper and lower eyelids beyond eyes, like the 60s heavy eye make up look. Coloured liner can also be used with black eyeliner, as it is becoming a trend. Pastel eyeliners, in blue, yellow and even orange will be "in" during the coming seasons.

For Navratri make-up,

you may want to try gold, silver or bronze shadow to line the eyes over your eyeliner on the upper lid. Highlight under the brows with gold, ivory or a light coloured eye shadow.

Then apply mascara. Roll-on mascara is easy to apply. While applying mascara on the upper lashes, look downwards. Apply it both above and below the upper lashes, for a thicker look. Apply on lower lashes too. Wait for a while and apply a second coat. Then brush out the lashes, with a small eyelash brush. To make lashes appear thicker, apply powder between two coats of mascara.

Gloss is popular for the lips. Use a lip liner the same colour as your lipstick. Apply lip gloss in the centre, after applying lipstick.

For normal Indian complexion, go for warm earthy colours, like coral, wine, plum, strawberry, red and shades of red in lipstick. A dark pink or rose-red would look good too. Orange and shades of orange are very much "in," from apricot and amber, to coral and tangerine. You can find orange shades that suit most skin colours. Use orange to coral for darker skin, while orange and peachy shades suit fair skin. If you use orange, go subtle for the rest of your face. Go for light orange or beige lipstick, lilac, mauve and light pink during the day, with a hint of pearl.Clean your makeup thoroughly once you are back from dandiya DJ . Makeup products left on your skin overnight do a lot of damage to your skin particularly if you are prone to acne..pimples and rashes .Get the perfect curl on medium heat for 10 seconds only to warm up your eye lash curler. begin curling your eye lashes from the roots. Keep pressing through the length till you reach the ends of the lash hair. Once you are happy with the way the lashes have curled, you can apply a curl enhancing mascara

Hidden there was a note that read, "I had the opportunity to take out Charlie Kirk and I'm going to take it." Tyler Robinson admitted to assassinating Turning Point USA founder Charlie Kirk at Utah Valley University in text messages with his roommate Lance Twiggs, revealing a planned attack and hiding a rifle, while facing charges including aggravated murder and witness tampering. The chilling messages show that Twiggs knew about Robinson’s role in the killing more than 24 hours before he was arrested. When Twiggs confronted him, Robinson responded bluntly, "I am. I’m sorry." Prosecutors also revealed another disturbing text in

These words, officials say, provide one of the clearest glimpses yet into Robinson’s mindset leading up to the attack. Pakistan's Foreign Minister Highlights India's Rejection Of Third-Party Mediation In Ceasefire Talks

(Gns). Pakistan’s Foreign Minister, Ishaq Dar, has acknowledged that India has consistently rejected third-party mediation in ceasefire discussions. The situation underscores ongoing tensions between India and Pakistan over how best to address their disputes. While both countries express interest in dialogue, differing views on mediation continue to pose challenges.

cleanliness and space management during the Preparatory Phase. Special attention will be given to record management, disposal of outdated materials, e-waste and the beautification of offices.

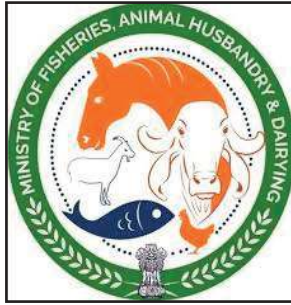

Lucknow, A team of surgeons and doctors at Balrampur Hospital has successfully removed a 20-kilogram tumor from the stomach of a woman from Faizabad. According to the doctors, the woman is now completely healthy. Doctors have claimed that this is the first time such a large tumor has been removed using such a complex operation. Dr. Saxena explained that the tumor was removed in several pieces during the two and a half hour operation. The tumor contained both solid and liquid components. The patient is currently admitted and her health is improving.

Under this agreement, DoP will leverage its unparalleled postal network of over 1.65 lakh Post Offices for sale of BSNL SIM cards and mobile recharge serv-

ices across the country. The vast reach of India Post, which touches almost every village and town in India, will serve as a powerful last-mile channel for BSNL to enhance its presence in both urban and rural geographies.

This initiative aims to make BSNL’s telecom services more accessible and affordable, particularly for citizens in the remotest parts of the country who often struggle with limited connectivity. By enabling Post Offices as service points, the partnership seeks to bridge the digital divide, empower rural households with mobile services, and advance the broader goals of Digital India, financial

inclusion, and socio-economic development. The proof of concept was implemented in Assam, where it has already shown significant success,

demonstrating its potential as a scalable model for nationwide rollout.

Through this collaboration, post offices will act as Points of Sale (PoS) for BSNL, Mobile SIM sale and for mobile recharges. BSNL will provide SIM stock and training, while DoP will onboard new customers for BSNL and facilitate transactions in a standardized and secure manner.

combines the trusted reach of India Post with the telecom expertise of BSNL to deliver affordable and accessible connectivity to every citizen.”
