



Amit Shah inaugurates Startup Conclave 2025 in Gujarat

(Gns). Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday inaugurated a two-day Startup Conclave 2025 in Gandhinagar of Gujarat, bringing founders, investors and policymakers from across India together for a wide-ranging showcase and policy dialogue. "The Startup Conclave is a platform to convert India's knowledge and innovation into jobs and businesses," he said on the occasion, while calling on investors to "help new startups grow". Shah also said in future these startups will, in turn, make investors "big". Accompanied by

Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel and Higher Education Minister Rushikesh Patel, the Union Home Minister said the country's youth was moving from "job-seekers to job-creators" and urged investors to back early-stage ventures. Shah said startups have provided employment to roughly 1.79 million people and noted that 48 per cent of new startups are founded by women — statistics he cited to underline the sector's growing social and

economic footprint. Over 170 startups are exhibiting, presenting products and services across sectors including technology, healthcare, agri-tech, fin-tech and green energy. The event features an exhibition of prototypes and demonstrations, a round-table conference that brings founders into direct dialogue with industry experts, and seven themed sessions focused on scaling innovation, financing models and university-industry linkages.



Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel welcomed the conclave as an opportunity to reinforce Gujarat's position as an entrepreneurial hub, while Higher Education Minister Rushikesh Patel highlighted the role of universities and research institutions in mentoring early-stage companies and translating academic research into commercial ventures. The conclave offered much-needed visibility and networking opportunities, but flagged persistent challenges. "Access to early-stage capital and pilot customers remains a bottleneck for many founders," one exhibitor opined.

Shashi Tharoor Slams Peter Navarro's 'Maharaja of Tariffs' Remark, Calls US Tariff Policy the Real Problem

(Gns). Tensions between India and the United States flared recently after Peter Navarro, once a key trade advisor in Donald Trump's White House, unleashed a volley of sharp words aimed at New Delhi. In a series of remarks that raised more than a few eyebrows, Navarro branded India the "maharaja of tariffs" and, more provocatively, a "laundromat of Russia." The comments sparked immediate pushback in India, not least from Congress MP Shashi Tharoor. Known for his frank assessments, Tharoor called the remarks not just unnecessary but damaging at a time when both countries are working

hard to strengthen ties. Speaking to ANI, he reminded that Indo-US relations had navigated three decades of mostly steady progress, making Navarro's barbs all the more jarring. Peter Navarro, a former trade advisor, criticized India's trade policies and

social aspects, leading to pushback from figures like Shashi Tharoor, while the U.S. imposed tariffs on Indian imports, sparking tensions despite their strategic partnership. But Navarro didn't just stop at trade. He also waded into social criticism, accusing India's Brahmins

of exploiting ordinary citizens. Tharoor quickly brushed that aside, suggesting the real irritant wasn't culture or caste but Trump's economic playbook. In his view, tariffs have become Trump's answer to fixing the US trade deficit, bolstering manufacturing at home, and serving political ends. Meanwhile, the policy side of the spat has been just as heated. This past August, Washington piled on a 25% tariff on Indian imports, only to follow it up with another 25% penalty in response to India's continued import of Russian oil. Unsurprisingly, these moves rattled Indian industries and deepened frustration across the board.

MEA S Jaishankar Meets US Secretary of State Marco Rubio Amid H-1B Visa Row

(Gns). Efforts to mend relations between New Delhi and Washington are underway, with both sides working towards a trade agreement. Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal is spearheading a delegation to Washington for negotiations. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar recently met US Secretary of State Marco Rubio during the 80th United Nations General Assembly session, where discussions focused on H-1B visa issues and trade matters. The meeting between Jaishankar and Rubio follows their previous encounter in July at the 10th Quad Foreign

Ministers' Meeting in Washington. This dialogue comes after tensions rose due to former President Donald Trump's decision to impose tariffs on Indian goods and increase H-1B visa application fees to \$100,000. India and the US are working toward a trade agreement, with Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal leading negotiations in Washington, following discussions between External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and US Secretary of State Marco Rubio on trade and H-1B

visa issues, after former President Donald Trump imposed tariffs and increased visa fees; Investment Treaty to restore stability in their economic relationship. President Trump expressed optimism about reaching an agreement, stating that there would be "no difficulty" in finalising a deal. He praised Prime Minister Modi's leadership and thanked him for supporting peace efforts in Ukraine. The Ministry of Commerce and Industry reported "positive discussions" during the September 16 visit by officials from the Office of the United States Trade Representative to India. These talks aim to address trade imbalances and strengthen economic ties between the two countries.



Raksha Mantri inaugurates TASL's defence manufacturing facility in Morocco for production of Wheeled Armoured Platform

Raksha Mantri Shri Rajnath Singh and Defence Minister of Morocco Mr Abdelatif Loudyi jointly inaugurated Tata Advanced Systems Limited's (TASL) state-of-the-art defence manufacturing facility in Berrechid, Morocco, on September 23, 2025. He described the occasion as a historic moment in the evolving strategic partnership between India and Morocco. Spread over 20,000 square metres, the facility will undertake production of the indigenously developed Wheeled Armoured Platform (WhAP) 8x8, jointly designed by TASL and India's Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).

The WhAP is a modern modular combat platform equipped with advanced mobility, protection and mission adaptability. Its features such as survivable monocoque hull with scalable ballistic and mine protection, independent suspension, central tyre inflation system and high-power engine ensure superior off-road performance. Configurations include infantry fighting vehicle, armoured personnel carrier, reconnaissance command post, mortar carrier and even ambulance variants. Options for manned or unmanned

remote weapon stations and anti-tank guided missile capability further enhance its versatility. Under its contract with the Government of Morocco, TASL will deliver WhAP 8x8 vehicles to the Royal Moroccan Army, with initial deliveries scheduled to begin next month. The facility became operational three months ahead of schedule, and production

Editorial

Fiscal Respite

The government's sweeping reduction of goods and services tax rates, unveiled on the eve of the festive season, is more than a routine fiscal tweak. It is a political and economic signal aimed at reviving consumption, boosting confidence, and nudging Indians toward a self-reliant economy even as trade tensions with the United States sharpen.

The timing is astute. From Durga Puja through Diwali and into the wedding months, household spending surges across India. By lowering GST on a wide range of essentials and semi-luxuries ~ everything from milk and life insurance to small cars, television sets, and air conditioners ~ the government has ensured that the benefits land precisely when consumers are most likely to spend. Lower interest rates and earlier income-tax relief add fuel to this seasonal stimulus.

The immediate beneficiaries are obvious: middle-class families gain purchasing power, and companies selling consumer goods and vehicles enjoy a demand spike. Early reports of rising enquiries at showrooms and upbeat stock prices in the auto sector underscore the quick impact. Yet the policy is not merely about festive sales. It comes wrapped in a larger call by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to embrace "Swadeshi," urging citizens to prefer Indian-made products and reduce dependence on foreign brands. The appeal to patriotic consumption serves both economic and diplomatic goals. As the United States imposes punishing tariffs on Indian exports, encouraging domestic demand for local goods offers a buffer against external shocks and signals political resolve.

Consumers may rejoice today, but tomorrow's bills will test whether this celebration of spending was affordable for the nation. For celebration must be tempered with caution. Generous tax cuts come at a cost to the exchequer. Official estimates put the immediate revenue loss at several billion dollars, but independent projections suggest the gap could be wider. Tax collections have already slowed even as government spending continues to rise. If revenues lag, the administration may face tough choices: rein in ambitious infrastructure projects or risk breaching fiscal deficit targets. Either path carries economic consequences, from dampening future growth to unsettling investor confidence. There is also the question of transmission.

The promised gains to consumers depend on how fully producers pass on the tax reductions. In sectors where supply chains are long and pricing opaque, savings may not entirely reach shoppers. Small traders, often slow to adjust labels and inventories, could lag in implementing the new rates, blunting the policy's immediate effect. Having said that, households will welcome cheaper goods and a reason to celebrate even if the longer-term test lies beyond the festival of lights. Sustained growth demands steady job creation, investment in productivity, and careful stewardship of public finances. The festive boost may lift spirits and sales, but only disciplined fiscal management will keep the economy on a stable, self-reliant path once the music fades. For now, the GST reforms must be welcomed as the game-changer they are projected to be. India is clearly fighting back against external pressures.

Will Pakistan-Saudi pact impact India?

The killing of Jamaal Khashoggi in the Saudi consulate in Istanbul in 2018 led to Riyadh facing global flak. US President Joe Biden promised to hold Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman accountable. Everything changed a year later when the US began courting Riyadh to stem the Chinese challenge to its domination in the Middle East. Biden's predecessor, Donald Trump, had negotiated the Abraham Accords which resulted in the UAE and Bahrain normalizing ties with Israel.

Biden had to do better and his target was Saudi Arabia. In July 2022, well before the Hamas attack on Israel, during Biden's visit to Riyadh, Mohammed bin Salman demanded a NATO-type defence pact in return for establishing ties with Israel. Recognition of Israel by Riyadh could change the Middle East landscape. The US suggested similar treaties as existing with a few Asian nations, including Japan and South Korea, or establishing a naval base similar to Bahrain. These actions could avoid Congressional approval, which would then have been difficult. Washington also offered to designate Saudi Arabia as a non-NATO ally, akin to Israel. But the Saudis sought assured guarantees to deter attacks such as the September 2019 Yemeni missile strikes on its oil facilities. For Biden, Riyadh recognizing Tel Aviv would have been a diplomatic victory. The Palestinians were agnostic.

Such an act would reduce support from Arab states and signal the end of a Palestinian state. In May 2024, months after the Hamas attack and Israel's retaliation, Washington again attempted to push another deal with the Saudis. As per CNN, this deal had three components. The first was a package of agreements between the US and Saudi Arabia, the second, normalization of relations between Riyadh and Israel, and the third was a pathway to a Palestinian state. The package of agreements would include security, economic and technological guarantees, as well as support for its civilian nuclear programme.

This also fell through because Israel refused to discuss the creation of a Palestinian State. Riyadh had rolled out the red carpet for Trump in his first international visit this year hoping for a security deal, but none was offered. The US currently has troops deployed in the Prince Sultan Air Base outside Riyadh. This left the Saudis disappointed. Riyadh continues facing threats from Iran (though China negotiated peace between them in 2023) and its proxies in Yemen. With the US unwilling to provide iron clad security, Europe would do not participate. Russia was uninterested.

The last straw for Riyadh was the Israeli strike on Iran and Qatar, another US ally. While the US joined the attack on Iran's nuclear facilities, it secretly supported the strike on Qatar. American air-to-air refuellers assisted the Israeli air force in its attacks on Qatar. This happened despite Qatar gifting an aircraft to Trump on his visit a few months ago and it being a close US ally. So much for trust in the US. Where do threats to Riyadh emerge from, apart from an internal Arab Spring? The major threat is from Iran and its proxies in Yemen. While the Yemenis could be handled, the concern was Iran and Israel in the long term. The Saudis wanted a security pact with a nation

Al, branding will need a human connection

Branding as a process still requires a "Sixth Sense" to feel and perceive, which no computational algorithm can replace. Despite AI's prowess in data processing, there are some things it simply cannot replicate. Emotional nuance and cultural intuition, hallmarks of great storytelling, remain deeply human qualities.

Branding thrives on narratives that resonate with audiences on a visceral level, and while AI can assist in generating content, it cannot fully grasp the subtleties of humour, nostalgia, or cultural symbolism. This is where human ingenuity will continue to shine. Brands that succeed in this era of AI-driven efficiency will be those that foster symbiotic partnerships between machine intelligence and human creativity.

Prospects of a deal

High-level trade talks between India and the United States resumed in New Delhi on 16 September 2025, after a recent thaw in tensions and positive public statements from both President Donald Trump and Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The latest round of discussion was led by the US delegation's chief negotiator, Assistant U.S. Trade Representative Brendan Lynch, and his Indian counterpart, Special Secretary in the Department of Commerce Rajesh Agrawal. A key outcome of the "positive and forward-looking" meeting was the mutual agreement to "intensify efforts" toward an early conclusion of a trade agreement.

Relations strained considerably after President Trump imposed new 50 per cent tariffs on Indian exports in August 2025. This move was partly a penalty for India's continued purchases of Russian oil amidst the Ukraine conflict. The tariffs significantly impacted trade, with Indian exports to the US falling from \$8.01 billion in July to \$6.86 billion in August. A breakthrough in the diplomatic stalemate occurred in September 2025 after President Trump posted optimistically about the ongoing negotiations on his social media platform, Truth Social. In response, Prime Minister Modi echoed the sentiment on X, expressing confidence in the bilateral trade discussions.

This exchange followed a period of hostile public comments from some US officials. Peter Navarro, a trade adviser in the Trump administration has made repeated critical comments about India, primarily regarding its trade relations with Russia and its high tariffs against the United States.

UP Government Moves to Erase Caste from Police Records: A Historic Step Against Discrimination

(Gns). In a landmark move following a scathing verdict from the Allahabad High Court, the Uttar Pradesh government, under Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, has ordered the complete removal of caste references from police records, official documents, public spaces, and government vehicles. The directive signals a bold attempt to dismantle entrenched caste biases within the state machinery. The Uttar Pradesh government, led by Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, has mandated the removal of caste references from police records and government resources, following an Allahabad High Court verdict that deemed such mentions unconstitutional; this directive aims to combat caste bias within the state’s official procedures. The September 16 order from the Allahabad High Court left little room for debate, calling the practice of noting caste in FIRs and arrest memos “a legal fallacy” that threatens the very essence of constitutional democracy. The court highlighted examples like FIRs listing Mali, Pahadi, Rajput, Thakur, Punjabi Parashar, and Brahmin-insisting that such labeling serves no lawful purpose and reflects deep insensitivity. “Rather than initiating departmental inquiries or educating officers about constitutional morality, the authorities defended this practice on flimsy grounds,” the court said. It urged both boards, and public displays. For identification, only the names of a person’s parents can now be used. Police manuals and SOPs will be updated to ensure strict adherence. Exemptions and Realities The only exceptions are cases under the SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, where caste information remains relevant for legal purposes. Still, experts say this historic directive marks a turning point in India’s battle against caste-based discrimination, challenging decades of bureaucratic inertia. With this decisive action, Uttar Pradesh is poised to set an example for the rest of the country, redefining how state machinery interacts with citizens and taking a significant step toward a truly caste-less society.

ED Attaches Rs 7.44 Crore Properties Linked to Satyendar Jain

(Gns). The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has attached properties worth Rs 7.44 crore under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002, linked to companies allegedly controlled by Satyendar Kumar Jain, former Delhi minister and AAP leader. This is part of an ongoing probe into money laundering allegations against him. Background of the Case The Enforcement Directorate (ED) attached properties worth Rs 7.44 crore under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002, connected to former Delhi minister and AAP leader Satyendar Kumar Jain, bringing the total attached assets to Rs 12.25 crore. The probe stems from a 2017 CBI case alleging Jain amassed disproportionate assets between February 2015 and May 2017, and the trial is ongoing at Rouse Avenue Court, New Delhi. Switch To Shorts The investigation traces back to a CBI case from 2017, which accused Jain of amassing disproportionate assets between February 2015 and May 2017 while serving as a minister. In December 2018, the CBI filed a chargesheet against Jain, his wife Poonam Jain, and others. Previously, in March 2022, the ED had attached assets worth Rs 4.81 crore. With the latest action, the total attached properties now value Rs 12.25 crore, which the agency claims represent all disproportionate assets allegedly acquired by Jain. Details of Financial Transactions After demonetisation in November 2016, Jain’s close associates, Ankush Jain and Vaibhav Jain, deposited Rs 7.44 crore as advance tax under the Income Disclosure Scheme (IDS). They declared assets worth Rs 16.53 crore in the names of four companies, later identified as beneficially owned by Satyendar Jain. The Income Tax Department and Delhi High Court ruled these associates were benami holders for Jain. The Supreme Court upheld this finding. The ED shared its findings with the CBI, leading to a supplementary chargesheet that increased the disproportionate assets attributed to Jain. Legal Proceedings The trial is ongoing at Rouse Avenue Court, New Delhi. The ED plans to file a supplementary prosecution complaint soon. Jain was arrested on May 30, 2022, over allegations of laundering money through four shell companies. He was granted bail after more than two years.

In a landmark operation on the first day of Navratri, a women-led police team conducted Ghaziabad's first-ever encounter by female officers. The team managed to apprehend a wanted criminal after a brief chase and gunfight near Lohia Nagar late Monday night.

According to police officials, the accused, identified as Jitendra, son of Nandkishore, and a resi-

dent of Sector-9, Vijay Nagar, is a known history-sheeter with over 10 cases of theft and robbery registered against him. He was intercepted during a routine night checking operation led by SHO Mahila Thana, Ritu Tyagi, along with two women sub-inspectors and two women head constables.

The incident occurred around 1:30 AM when the team noticed a man on a scooter approaching from the Meerut Road side. When signaled to stop, the man attempted to flee by

turning his scooter around. During the pursuit, he lost control and fell. As he tried to escape on foot, he opened fire on the police with a country-made pistol.

In response, the women officers strategically surrounded him and returned fire, injuring him in the leg. He was then overpowered and arrested.

The women officers carried the criminal on their shoulders, placed him in a police vehicle, and rushed him to MMG District Hospital, Ghaziabad, for treatment.
