PM Modi to inaugurate World Food India 2025 on Thursday

(Gns).

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the fourth edition of World Food India (WFI) 2025 on Thursday at 6:00 PM at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi, a release from his office said.

The event, scheduled from September 25 to 28, will bring together over 1,700 exhibitors, 500 international buyers, and representatives from more than 100 countries to showcase India's strengths in the food processing sector, food sustainability, and production of nutritious and organic food.

Over 100 countries,

including New Zealand and Saudi Arabia as Partner Countries, and Japan, Russia, the UAE, and Vietnam as Focus Countries, will participate in the event.

Multiple sessions will cover topics such as India as a Global Food Processing Hub, Sustainability and Net Zero in Food Processing, and Frontiers in Food Processing, among others.

Fourteen pavilions will feature specific themes, including international, state, and ministry pavilions, as well as areas dedicated to pet food, technology, and start-up innovation.

B2B, B2G, and G2G meetings will facilitate business interactions and partnerships.

Over Rs 770 crore will



be provided to around 26,000 beneficiaries for micro projects in the food processing sector under the PMFME Scheme.

World Food India 2025 aims to position India as a global hub for food innovation, investment, and sustainability. The event will showcase India's food processing potential, encourage investments and partnerships, promote innovation and sustainability in the food sector, and enhance India's food security and exports.

The event is expected to attract around 100,000 visitors and feature prominent dignitaries, including Russia's Deputy Prime Minister Dmitry Patrushev and Union Ministers Nitin Gadkari and Chirag Paswan.

President Murmu to visit Vrindavan by special train on Thursday

Amit Shah did not call for Modi's resignation or criticise Ajit Doval for Op Sindoor

A video, claiming that Union Home Minister Amit Shah has asked for criticising and demanding resignation of Prime Minister Narendra Modi for Operation Sindoor, has gone viral on the social media platforms. The doctored video has been branded fake by the fact-check unit of the Press Information Bureau.

Sharing the doctored video on X handle, The Whistle Blower wrote, "Indian Home Minister Amit Shah directly blames Ajit

Doval and India PM Modi for the defeat in Operation Sindoor. Says Pakistani missiles hit multiple locations uncontested. Amit Shah demands resignation from Modi over failed Operation Sindoor. (sic)"

The clip is doctored from Shah's interview with Rahul Joshi, the Group Editor-in-Chief of Network 18. The doctored clip starts with the host asking the Home

Minister about his association with Modi. "I have seen very difficult times for Modi Ji; many crises came, but the time that has come now has never happened before. The complete plan for Operation Sindoor that Doval Ji gave us—we made a huge mistake in it. The biggest mistake was that we underestimated Pakistan. We thought we would fly our Rafales and Pakistan would not do anything. But when we



heard Colonel Sophia's press conference, the reality came out," he says.

"Pakistan rained missiles down on more than 26 places. I still cannot believe how this happened. Where did Modi Ji's India Development go? Now, only one thing is clear: Modi Ji, now just resign and go home. The leadership of the BJP should now go to a new leader. All this is what is in my heart, and now the entire public is saying it too. Enough is enough," the video adds further.

Shashi Tharoor Slams Peter Navarro's 'Maharaja of Tariffs' Remark, Calls US Tariff Policy the Real Problem

Tensions between India and the United States flared recently after Peter Navarro, once a key trade advisor in Donald Trump's White House, unleashed a volley of sharp words aimed at New Delhi. In a series of remarks that raised more than a few eyebrows, Navarro branded India the "maharaja of tariffs" and, more provocatively, a "laundromat of Russia."

The comments sparked immediate pushback in India, not least from Congress MP Shashi Tharoor. Known for his frank assessments, Tharoor called the remarks not just unnecessary but damaging at a time when

both countries are working hard to strengthen ties. Speaking to ANI, he reminded that Indo-US relations had navigated three decades of mostly steady progress, making Navarro's barbs all the more jarring.

Peter Navarro, a former trade advisor, criticized India's trade policies and social aspects, leading to pushback from figures like Shashi Tharoor, while the U.S. imposed tariffs on Indian imports, sparking tensions despite their strategic partnership.

But Navarro didn't just stop at trade. He also

waded into social criticism, accusing India's Brahmins of exploiting ordinary citizens. Tharoor quickly brushed that aside, suggesting the real irritant was



n't culture or caste but Trump's economic playbook. In his view, tariffs have become Trump's answer to fixing the US trade deficit, bolstering manufacturing at home,

and serving political ends.

Meanwhile, the policy side of the spat has been just as heated. This past August, Washington piled on a 25% tariff on Indian imports, only to follow it up with another 25% penalty in response to India's continued import of Russian oil. Unsurprisingly, these moves rattled Indian industries and deepened frustration across the board.

In the bigger picture, the episode demonstrates how words and actions can quickly unsettle even trusted partnerships. India and the US may be natural allies in defense, technology, and global strategy, but flare-ups like these test the resilience of the relationship.

Political climate of Bihar heats up as INDIA bloc offers sops to EBC voters

With an eye on the crucial Bihar Assembly elections due in October-November, the INDIA bloc launched the 'Ati-Pichhra Nyaya Sankalp', a 10-point resolution to ensure socio-political and economic justice for the Extremely Backward Class (EBC) communities, in Patna on Wednesday.

The politically crucial EBC communities are able to reshape Bihar's politics. Every party has been trying to secure their fragmented loyalties ahead of the 2025 Assembly elections in the state.

Launching the resolution, Leader of the

Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi, stating that the Nitish Kumar government did not do anything for the EBC communi-



ties during his 20-year rule, alleged that the Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar "used them as a vote bank".

Going to the resolution, if voted to power in the

state, the INDIA bloc will ensure 30 per cent reservation for EBC communities in Panchayats and Urban Local Bodies, 50 per cent

The new government will enact a law, aptly titled "Extremely Backward Atrocities Prevention Act" and a high-powered Reservation Regulatory Authority would be established to oversee reservation matters, and any changes to the reservation list of castes will only be possible with the legislature's approval.

Under the Right to Education Act (2010), passed by the previous UPA government at the Centre, half of the reserved seats in private schools will be allocated for children from Extremely Backward Classes, Backward Castes, Scheduled Castes.

Mission Shakti: UP Government's Initiative to Enhance Women's Safety and Support

The Uttar Pradesh Police has issued comprehensive guidelines for establishing Mission Shakti centres at all police stations in the state, following a directive from Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath. Part of the government's flagship Mission Shakti campaign, these centres are designed to strengthen women's safety, dignity, and self-reliance while ensuring prompt action in crimes against women.

Mission Shakti centres will operate like mini police outposts, exclusively focused on cases involving women. Each centre will be headed by a sub-inspector, preferably a woman, and supported by additional sub-inspectors, constables,

female home guards, and counsellors. Officers will serve a tenure of three to five years, with transfers allowed only after specialised training.

Following Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's directive, the Uttar Pradesh Police established Mission Shakti centres at all police stations, focused on women's safety and empowerment. These centers, headed by sub-inspectors, provide support services including counseling, legal aid, and coordinate with related agencies to help women.

Every police station is required to allocate a separate room for the Mission Shakti centre, fully equipped with computers, records,

stationery, dedicated women's restrooms, and space for counselling and victim support activities. These facilities aim to



ensure that victims of crime receive immediate and effective assistance.

The centres will perform a range of responsibilities, including preparing duty ros-

ters for Women's Help Desks, supervising Anti-Romeo squads, maintaining parallel FIR records for women-related cases, and coordinating with one-stop centres, district legal aid authorities, probation officers, and family courts. They will also provide counselling, rehabilitation, legal guidance, and compensation support for victims. In sensitive cases, such as elopement or false allegations, mandatory counselling sessions will be organised to support all parties involved.

Beyond law enforcement, Mission Shakti centres will focus on awareness campaigns on women's safety, cyber security, and social empowerment.

Editorial

Style Over Substance

US President Donald Trump's second state visit to Britain unfolded as a masterclass in spectacle. Royal banquets, military fly-pasts and carefully choreographed fashion moments offered a dazzling distraction from the political storms both sides of the Atlantic are facing. For Prime Minister Keir Starmer, still smarting from the uproar over a controversial ambassadorial appointment, the visit provided precisely the breathing space he needed. For Trump, it delivered the validation he thrives on: the pomp of monarchy, global headlines and the glow of a country willing to roll out its most elaborate welcome. The chemistry between the two leaders was on full display.

Smiles, backslaps and warm words dominated their joint appearance, even as they skirted issues that could have caused sparks. On the United Kingdom's impending recognition of a Palestinian state, Mr Trump limited himself to a mild "disagreement." On illegal migration, he recommended tough measures but avoided a public clash. Even the uncomfortable shadow of Jeffrey Epstein ~ linked to a dismissed British envoy and once to Mr Trump ~ was smothered with practiced vagueness. It was diplomacy by stagecraft: polite nods to difference, no risks taken. The Windsor ceremonies also highlight how modern diplomacy increasingly relies on optics to reassure domestic audiences.

Lavish welcomes and glittering photographs can create the impression of progress even when negotiations remain frozen, buying leaders precious political capital at home without requiring the concessions or compromises that genuine policy breakthroughs demand. Yet, beneath the glitter lay the limits of Britain's leverage. Despite the meticulous hospitality, Mr Trump showed no sign of shifting his positions on trade, tariffs or global conflicts. His team admitted as much, noting that no amount of royal pageantry would influence his core policies. Mr Starmer's reward for his careful choreography was not a breakthrough on steel tariffs or West Asia strategy, but a cordial relationship that allows for disagreement without retaliation. In today's geopolitical climate, even that modest outcome counts as an achievement. This visit underscores a hard truth about modern alliances. Symbolic gestures can build rapport and defuse tension, but they rarely alter strategic calculations.

Britain demonstrated that it can host an unpredictable American President without incident, and Mr Starmer proved adept at keeping Mr Trump engaged while avoiding provocation. Yet when Air Force One departed, the underlying realities remained intact. US trade policy, military priorities and West Asia calculations will continue to be shaped in Washington, not Windsor. Still, symbolism matters. In an era of fractious politics and eroding norms, the ability to maintain a functional relationship with a mercurial superpower leader is valuable in itself. Mr Starmer's balancing act ~ firm on principle, generous in ceremony ~ earned Britain a measure of goodwill and a temporary respite from domestic turmoil. But pageantry, however dazzling, is not power. The lesson of this visit is that even the grandest banquet cannot substitute for the hard currency of influence.

144 years old, died in 2025, KGMU's shameful death certificate

Mohammad Saif Lucknow's King George's Medical University, once a paragon of medical excellence, is now in the headlines for its own actions. This hospital, once a symbol of saving lives, is now becoming synonymous with stories of negligence and irresponsibility. Within these walls, where patients come with hope, an incident has occurred that is not only heartbreaking but also exposes the shortcomings of the entire government system. This is the story of 45-year-old Pramod Kumar Singh, whose life was not only mocked, but his death documents also exposed the system's true nature.

After Pramod's death, when his family was handed the death certificate, the scene was nothing short of a tragedy. The certificate listed his age as 144, as if he were an immortal soul, haunting the hospital's doorsteps for centuries.

And even more astonishing? The time of death was listed as August 11, 2025,

Will Pakistan-Saudi pact impact India?

The killing of Jamaal Khashoggi in the Saudi consulate in Istanbul in 2018 led to Riyadh facing global flak. US President Joe Biden promised to hold Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman accountable. Everything changed a year later when the US began courting Riyadh to stem the Chinese challenge to its domination in the Middle East. Biden's predecessor, Donald Trump, had negotiated the Abraham Accords which resulted in the UAE and Bahrain normalizing ties with Israel.

Biden had to do better and his target was Saudi Arabia. In July 2022, well before the Hamas attack on

Israel, during Biden's visit to Riyadh, Mohammed bin Salman demanded a NATO-type defence pact in return for establishing ties with Israel. Recognition of Israel by Riyadh could change the Middle East landscape. The US suggested similar treaties as existing with a few Asian nations, including Japan and South Korea, or establishing a naval base similar to Bahrain. These actions could avoid Congressional approval, which would then have been difficult. Washington also offered to designate Saudi Arabia as a non-NATO ally, akin to Israel. But the Saudis sought assured guarantees to deter attacks such as the September 2019 Yemeni

missile strikes on its oil facilities. For Biden, Riyadh recognizing Tel Aviv would have been a diplomatic victory. The Palestinians were aghast.

Such an act would reduce support from Arab states and signal the end of a Palestinian state. In May 2024, months after the Hamas attack and Israel's retaliation, Washington again attempted to push another deal with the Saudis. As per CNN, this deal had three components. The first was a package of agreements between the US and Saudi Arabia, the second, normalization of relations between Riyadh and Israel, and the third was a pathway to a Palestinian state. The

package of agreements would include security, economic and technological guarantees, as well as support for its civilian nuclear programme.

This also fell through because Israel refused to discuss the creation of a Palestinian State. Riyadh had rolled out the red carpet for Trump in his first international visit this year hoping for a security deal, but none was offered. The US currently has troops deployed in the Prince Sultan Air Base outside Riyadh. This left the Saudis disappointed. Riyadh continues facing threats from Iran (though China negotiated peace between them in 2023) and its proxies in Yemen.



Centre organises seminar to underscore robust, flexible IP regime under India-UK CETA

A seminar on "Demystifying the IPR Chapter in the India-UK CETA" was organised to discuss opportunities and concerns surrounding the Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) provisions in the India-UK Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA).

Organised by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) and the Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, in collaboration with the Centre for Trade and Investment Law (CTIL), brought together policy-makers, legal experts, academics, and industry repre-

sentatives.

At the event, experts emphasised that the IPR chapter balances fostering innovation with ensuring public access. They highlighted that the provisions preserve safeguards for public health and align with India's developmental priorities, while modernising the country's IP framework.

Voluntary licensing was reaffirmed as the preferred industry practice, with compulsory licensing and public health flexibilities under the Doha Declaration remaining intact.

Addressing concerns about patent process harmonisation, officials clarified that the measures are

procedural improvements and do not compromise India's regulatory autonomy.

Geographical Indications (GIs) were flagged as a major opportu-



nity, with stronger protection for Indian GIs in the UK market expected to boost exports, benefit startups and MSMEs, and promote India's cultural heritage globally.

Panelists dispelled myths about the agreement, stressing that the IPR provisions neither limit India's policy space nor undermine domestic regulations. Instead, they reflect India's current legal framework while signalling a robust and forward-looking IP regime to global partners and investors.

Concluding the seminar, participants noted that the IPR chapter could serve as a model for future trade negotiations, blending regulatory rigour with flexibility, promoting innovation, and strengthening India's standing in the global trade arena.
