



## Will PM Modi Meet Trump At ASEAN Summit? MEA Responds

(Gns). India's Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on Friday commented on the possibility of a meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US President Donald Trump during the upcoming ASEAN Summit in Malaysia later this month.

The summit is scheduled to take place from October 26 to 28 in Kuala Lumpur. Speaking at a press briefing, MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal noted that the summit has not yet occurred and said that relevant information regarding any meeting between the two leaders will be shared at the appropriate time, hinting

that a Modi-Trump encounter may take place. India's MEA commented on a potential meeting

Donald Trump at the ASEAN Summit in Kuala Lumpur from October 26-28, amid ongoing trade negotiations. If it occurs, it would be the first meeting since the US imposed tariffs on Indian imports citing India's purchase of Russian oil, according to MEA.

Trump to Attend ASEAN Summit

Malaysia has informed India that President Trump will be in Kuala Lumpur from October 26 to 28 to attend both the ASEAN and East Asia summits. While no official announcement has been made regarding PM Modi's attendance, preparations are reportedly underway. Similarly, the US has not issued a formal statement regarding Trump's visit, neither from the White House nor the State Department.

(Gns). Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar has appealed to women voters to keep him in mind while casting their votes in the upcoming Bihar Assembly elections, citing his government's continued efforts for women's upliftment since 2005 and promising to do much more if re-elected.

"I am speaking to every woman. We have done a lot for you. 'Chunav aa raha hai... aap log bhi dhyani dijiyega' (Elections are approaching... please keep us in mind)," he said, while

addressing a group of beneficiaries under the Mukhyamantri Mahila Rozgar Yojana via video conferencing on Friday.

Launched as a step toward women's self-reliance, the

Opposition has criticised the move as another populist measure by Nitish Kumar to woo women voters ahead of the elections.

On 26 September, Prime Minister Narendra



Modi transferred Rs 7,500 crore via Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) to 75 lakh women beneficiaries, each receiving Rs10,000 under the scheme. On Friday, Nitish Kumar followed up

by transferring an additional Rs 2,500 crore to another 25 lakh women beneficiaries, again at Rs 10,000 each.

In total, Rs 10,000 crore has been transferred to one crore women beneficiaries. The remaining eligible applicants are scheduled to receive their payments on 6 October.

## Single Biggest Risk to Democracy: Rahul Gandhi's Statement Draws BJP Fire

(Gns). During an interaction at Colombia's EIA University, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi criticised the Narendra Modi-led government. He stated that the "attack on democracy in India" is the "single biggest risk." The BJP responded by accusing him of attempting to divide India during his foreign visit.

Gandhi emphasised India's diverse nature, highlighting its multiple religions, traditions, languages, and ideas. He asserted that India's democratic system provides space for everyone to engage in dialogue. However, he expressed concern over what he

described as a comprehensive assault on this democratic framework.

In a discussion at Colombia's EIA University, Rahul Gandhi criticised the Narendra Modi-led government, stating that the attack on democracy is the biggest risk, which the BJP responded to by accusing him of attempting to divide India during his foreign visit.

Gandhi pointed out that India cannot emulate China's authoritarian model due to its diverse linguistic and cultural landscape. He

According to him, suppressing people under an authoritarian regime would not suit India's design.

The BJP strongly reacted to Gandhi's comments, labelling him a "Leader of Propaganda."

calls for international intervention in India's affairs.

Gandhi also mentioned the risks within India's structure, identifying the attack on democracy as the primary threat. He highlighted the need for India to overcome these challenges while maintaining its democratic ethos.

nation for cost-effective quality healthcare.

Inaugurating the exhibi-

tions align with the Prime Minister's vision of Atmanirbhar Bharat by reducing reliance on imports,

Vishwabandhu Bharat by exporting devices like heart valves and MRI-compatible shunts and Viksit Bharat 2047 through revenue generation and industry partnerships in the private sector.

Citing examples, Dr. Jitendra Singh said the institute has already provided heart valves to over two lakh patients and advanced shunts to about 2,000 patients, while innovations like the Hemostasis Patch have proved critical in trauma and battlefield care. He noted that such achievements are often under-recognized even within leading hospitals.

The Minister highlighted that SCTIMST's contribu-

## Editorial

### Ongoing Doubt

Britain's immigration debate has entered a new and unsettling phase. A proposal by the Nigel Farage-led Reform UK party to abolish the right of long-term migrants to settle permanently strikes at the very heart of how the United Kingdom defines fairness, stability, and trust in government. The plan would end the pathway known as indefinite settlement, replacing it with a system of renewable visas that must be reapplied for every few years under stricter conditions.

Higher salary thresholds, tougher language requirements, and ongoing compliance checks would become the norm. At first glance, the argument sounds simple: reduce fiscal pressure, prioritise citizens, and discourage welfare dependence. Advocates speak of massive budgetary savings and a system that rewards only the most economically valuable newcomers. Yet these claimed savings are built on shaky foundations. Migrants who qualify for permanent residence typically work, pay taxes, and contribute to growth. Many claim benefits only temporarily or while unemployed, and their presence often fills critical gaps in health care, technology, and other essential sectors.

Weakening their security could push skilled workers elsewhere, reduce tax revenues, and increase recruitment costs for British businesses already facing labour shortages. The most disturbing element lies in the proposal's retroactive sweep. Individuals and families who entered the country legally, played by the rules, and built their lives on the promise of eventual permanence would suddenly find that promise revoked. Children who consider Britain their only home could be forced into cycles of visa renewals, each carrying the risk of rejection. Such a move would almost certainly invite legal challenges and create administrative chaos, but the deeper damage would be moral: it would erode the basic expectation that government commitments endure beyond the next election. Such abrupt reversals risk turning lawful migration into a gamble, where personal futures hinge on shifting political winds and economic calculations.

Supporters claim that other nations maintain similar restrictions, but these comparisons ignore key differences. Countries with tighter residency rules often provide alternative routes to long-term stability, or operate under legal frameworks that do not share Britain's history of common-law protections. Importing only the harshest elements of foreign systems while discarding their safeguards is a recipe for insecurity, not reform.

A hundred years ago, on the sacred occasion of Vijayadashami, the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh was founded. This was not the creation of something entirely new. It was a newer manifestation of an ancient tradition, where India's eternal national consciousness expresses itself periodically, in different forms, to face the challenges of the times. In our times, the Sangh is the embodiment of that timeless national consciousness. It is the good fortune of our generation of swayamsevaks that we are witnessing the Sangh's centenary. On this historic occasion, I extend my greetings to the countless swayamsevaks who remain dedicated to the pledge of serving the nation and its people.

I also bow in reverence to the founder of the Sangh, our guiding ideal, Param Pujya Dr. Hedgewar Ji. To mark this glorious journey of a hundred years, the Government of India has released a special postage stamp and commemorative coin. Human civilizations thrived on the banks of great rivers. Similarly, countless lives have flourished due to the impact of the Sangh. A river enriches each part of the land that it touches with its waters. Likewise, the Sangh has nourished every part of our nation, every sphere of our society. A river often multi-

plies into many streams and expands its impact. Something similar has happened in the Sangh's journey. Through its various affiliated organisations, the Sangh works in every domain of life, such as education, agriculture, social welfare, tribal welfare, women's empowerment and more.

Though diverse in their fields of work, they all embody one spirit and one resolve: 'Nation First'. From its very inception, the Sangh has devoted itself to nation-building. To achieve this, it chose the path of character-building. Vyakti nirmaan se rashtra nirmaan, nation-building through character-building – this has been the Sangh's path. For this, it created the unique, simple and enduring mechanism of the daily shakha. ## Living longer, living better

W B Yeats' iconic opening line of the poem 'Sailing to Byzantium', 1926, declares on a sad note 'that is no country for old men'. In a systematically developed series of images the poet unravels the contexts of growing old and highlights how aging often evolves into irrelevance rather than a value for wisdom.

The theme has later been developed into equally powerful works of art and cinema such as Cormac McCarthy's 2005 novel and the Coen Brothers' 2007 film adaptation, both of which explore the theme of aging and the difficulty of maintaining relevance in a rapidly changing world. Since 14 December 1990, when the United Nations General Assembly designated October 1 as the International Day of Older Persons, there has been growing awareness of the necessity of recognizing the importance of the older persons as stakeholders in the collective development of the society.

Contemporary statistics on world population reveal that the number of older people (defined as those aged 65 years or older) tripled from around 260 million in 1980 to 761 million in 2021. Between 2021 and 2050, the global share of the older population is pro-

jected to increase from less than 10 per cent to around 17 per cent. The number of people aged 60 years or over has more than doubled, from around 541 million in 1995 to 1.2 billion in 2025 and is projected to reach 2.1 billion by 2050. By 2080, persons aged 65 or older will outnumber children under 18.

This surge in the population of the older persons is ascribed to the fact that global life expectancy has reached 73.5 years in 2025, an increase of 8.6 years since 1995 largely due to advances in geriatric care and greater reach of medical management of age-related issues. It is common knowledge that as populations age, the demand for healthcare and social support surges, especially for those with conditions like dementia, a major cause of dependency and disability in older adults. Specialized care is now essential to meet these growing needs. Also, women, who comprise most care recipients and caregivers, contribute roughly 70 per cent of global informal care hours.

This is especially true in low- and middle-income countries with limited care services, making women more vulnerable to poverty in old age. In societies with aging populations, it is cru-

cially important to adjust to the increasing number of elderly individuals who possess a diverse range of functional capacities. The capability to carry out essential functions and partake in everyday activities is influenced not solely by an individual's inherent talent and abilities but also by the social and physical environments in which they reside. Supportive environments play a pivotal role in assisting older individuals to maintain their activity levels and independence as they progress in age.

While the issues concerning older persons are universally acknowledged, there is a general realization that society as a collective entity is increasingly failing to accommodate older persons in its fold largely due to the erroneous assumption that values of individuals are dictated more by their economic output than by their inherent and intrinsic value as individuals who bring life skills, wisdom and avenues of mental support to the young. The result of this misplaced priority is often turning devastating for the older persons.

Not only are they generally sidelined in a priority scale, increasing resources required to cater to their health issues are often considered as burdens for

which there would be no material return. Even when there are no financial commitments required to cater to the health issues of older persons, equally crucial issues of social and value compatibility in a rapidly evolving society often blindsides the older persons who are relegated to negligence or even pushed out into professional geriatric care settings such as old age homes. Tragically, such individuals are forced to lead lonely lives even in the presence of blood relatives and networks of close friends.

It is universally accepted that though we are midway through the United Nations-mandated Decade of Healthy Ageing (2021-2030), most identified priorities in this sector are yet to gain importance in global policy or intervention frameworks. There is an urgent necessity of bringing together governments, civil society, international agencies, professionals, academia, the media, and the private sector for sustained, concerted, catalytic and collaborative action to improve the lives of older people, their families, and the communities in which they live.

Yellow is not only the colour of sunshine and hope, very American and

forceful, it is also the colour of deceit and untruthfulness, tinted with shocking dishonesty. Being the youngest of the four in the photograph, she exuded confidence and bravado of the arm-candy of the world's most powerful man, even though he remains the most vilified at home and abroad. The aging Queen Camilla wore a deep purple dress, flowing to the floor, fully covering her arms. Besides the bejewelled tiara, she had donned the Royal Family Order of Charles III for the occasion. This decoration is conferred by the head of a Royal Family to their female relations; a Royal Family Order is considered more of a personal memento than a state decoration. Featuring a small portrait of the Sovereign attached to a ribbon, this Order's history dates back to King George IV in 1820.

## 'Will Erase From Map, Won't Exercise Restraint': Army Chief Warns Pakistan

(Gns). India has issued a stern warning to Pakistan, urging it to stop supporting terrorism or risk losing its geographical presence, Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi said on Friday. Speaking at an Army post in Anupgarh, Rajasthan, Gen Dwivedi stated that Pakistan, known for backing terror networks through its deep state, must end state-sponsored terrorism if it wants to remain on the world map.

Gen Dwivedi emphasized that the Indian Armed Forces will not show the same restraint as they did during Operation Sindoor 1.0, signaling a more decisive response this time. "This time we will not maintain the restraint that we had in Operation Sindoor

1.0. This time we will do something that will make Pakistan think whether it wants to retain its place in Geography or not. If Pakistan wants to retain its place in Geography, then it must stop state-sponsored terrorism," he said.

The Army Chief's com-



ments underline India's determination to respond firmly to cross-border terrorism. By referring to Operation Sindoor, he hinted that a second, stronger operation could follow if Pakistan continues to export terror.

Gen Dwivedi's warning also sends a clear geopolitical message: Pakistan's continued involvement in

terrorism has consequences, and India is prepared to act decisively to protect its borders and citizens. The statement reinforces that India's patience has limits and that restraint may no longer guide its future military responses if provocations continue.

Speaking from a sensitive border region, Gen Dwivedi stressed that the Indian forces are fully prepared for any situation, highlighting the seriousness of India's stance against terrorism. His remarks are a clear signal to Islamabad that state-backed terror will not be tolerated, and Pakistan must reconsider its actions to maintain its international and geographical relevance.

## Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) fines Drishti IAS ₹5 lakh for misleading UPSC 2022 result ads

(Gns). The Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has imposed a penalty of ₹ 5 lakh on Drishti IAS (VDK Eduventures Pvt. Ltd.) for publishing misleading advertisements regarding the results of the UPSC Civil Services Examination (CSE) 2022.

Drishti IAS in its advertisement prominently claimed "216+ selections in UPSC CSE 2022" along with names and photographs of successful candidates.

However, upon examination, CCPA found that the claim was misleading and concealed crucial information regarding the type and duration of courses opted by these candidates.

The investigation revealed that out of the 216

candidates claimed by Drishti IAS, as many as 162 candidates (75%) had only taken the free Interview Guidance Programme (IGP) of the Institute, after

2019. Repeat violation by Drishti IAS: CCPA also noted that this is the second penalty imposed on Drishti IAS for similar conduct.



Earlier, in September 2024, the Authority had passed a final order against Drishti IAS for its misleading claim of "150+ selections in UPSC CSE 2021". Institute submitted the details of 161 candidates against its claim of 150+ selection in UPSC CSE 2021. In that case too, it was found that out of these 161 candidates, 148 were enrolled in IGP, 7 were enrolled in Mains Mentorship Program, 4

were enrolled in GS Foundation Program, 1 in Optional course and details of remaining 1 candidate was not mentioned. CCPA imposed penalty of ₹ 3 lakh and directed to discontinue the misleading advertisement.

Despite being penalized and cautioned earlier, Drishti IAS once again indulged in the same practice for the 2022 examination results by enhancing its claim to "216+ selections", thereby showing repeated non-compliance and disregard of consumer protection norms.

The concealment of such crucial information deprived prospective students and parents of their right to make an informed choice under Section 2(9) of the Consumer Protection Act, 2019.
