PM Modi Invites Ethiopian PM To AI Impact Summit, BRICS Meet In India

(Gns).
Prime Minister Narendra Modi has invited Ethiopian Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed Ali to attend the next AI Impact Summit, scheduled to be held in India in February next year, and the BRICS Summit that India plans to host in 2026, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Wednesday.

Briefing the media on the Prime Minister's visit to Ethiopia, MEA Secretary (ER) Sudhakar Dalela said India will assume the chairship of the BRICS grouping for a one-year term starting January 1, 2026.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi invited Ethiopian Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed Ali to the AI Impact Summit in India next year and the 2026

BRICS Summit, as India will assume BRICS chairship from January 1, 2026. During his visit to Ethiopia, Modi and Ali discussed cooperation, witnessed the exchange of MoUs, and Modi received the Great Honour Nishan of Ethiopia.

Dalela said Prime Minister Modi is scheduled to address a joint session of the Ethiopian Parliament later on Wednesday. During the day, he will also meet the Speaker of Parliament and other senior Ethiopian leaders. As part of his engagements, the Prime Minister will visit the Adwa Museum and pay tribute at the Adwa Victory Memorial.

According to the MEA, Prime Minister Modi arrived in Ethiopia on Tuesday and received a warm welcome.

In a special gesture, Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed Ali personally drove Prime Minister Modi to the National Science Museum and Friendship Park in Addis Ababa. Prime Minister Modi was later accorded a ceremonial welcome at the National Palace, where he inspected the Guard of Honour. The two leaders then held detailed bilateral talks covering political, economic and strategic cooperation.

The MEA said Prime Minister Modi thanked Prime Minister Abiy for Ethiopia's strong support to India in the fight against terrorism "in all its manifestations."

Both leaders witnessed the exchange of several Memoranda of Understanding across key

sectors. These include agreements on customs cooperation, training for United Nations peacekeep-

ing missions, and the establishment of a data centre at the Ethiopian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Dalela said.

Earlier on Tuesday, the MEA released the official outcomes of the Prime Minister's shift, leading to Bangladesh summoning the Indian High Commissioner.

The decision follows strong protests lodged by

Minister's visit, highlighting the elevation of India-Ethiopia relations to a Strategic Partnership as a

cooperation and mutual administrative assistance in customs matters, an MoU to establish a data centre at Ethiopia's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and an implementing arrangement for cooperation in training for United Nations peace-keeping operations.

India and Ethiopia also signed an MoU on debt restructuring under the G20 Common Framework, reflecting closer coordination on economic and financial issues. Educational cooperation was strengthened with a decision to double scholarships for Ethiopian students under the Indian Council for Cultural Relations pro-

gramme and to offer specialised short-term courses in Artificial Intelligence under the Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation initiative.

In the healthcare sector, India committed to supporting capacity augmentation at the Mahatma Gandhi Hospital in Addis Ababa, with a focus on maternal and neonatal care.

Meanwhile, Prime Minister Modi expressed gratitude after being conferred Ethiopia's highest civilian honour, the Great Honour Nishan of Ethiopia, calling it a matter of immense pride and a recognition of the strong and historic ties between

the two countries. Thanking the people and government of Ethiopia and Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed Ali, he said the honour belonged to the many Indians who have contributed over the years to strengthening bilateral relations. He added that being honoured by one of the world's most ancient civilisations was deeply meaningful.

Ethiopia conferred the award on Tuesday, making Prime Minister Modi the first global Head of State or Government to receive the honour. This recognition marks the 28th top foreign state award bestowed on Prime Minister Narendra Modi.



India Halts Visa Services in Dhaka Over Threats From Radical Bangladeshi Leaders

Amid rising diplomatic strain and mounting security concerns, India has suspended visa services at its Visa Application Centre in Dhaka after a series of radical and hostile statements targeting New Delhi and its territorial integrity.

India suspended visa services at its Dhaka application center due to rising diplomatic strain and security concerns following radical statements against New Delhi, prompting India to formally convey its concerns after the center closed at Jamuna Future Park on the same day. The State Bank of India accepts visa applications across 16 centers in Bangladesh, pro-

cessing approximately 22 lakh annually amidst escalating anti-India rhetoric and the interim govern-

All applicants who have appointment slots booked for submission today will be given a slot at a later date," the Visa Application Centre said in an official statement.

Time to step up!

It is with great pleasure I would like to announce that I am now a father. Both mother and child are fine. Thank you to anyone who sends their blessings and keeps us in their prayers. But as I hold my newborn in the sterile safety of the hospital room, looking out at the grey haze of Delhi, my joy is tempered by a terrifying reality. For the past few days, my world has shrunk to these corridors, and while awaiting this miracle, I have been haunted by what I see in the wards around me. I watch doctors rush to attend to newborns who are too small, too fragile, and struggling too hard for every breath.

I see parents, their eyes hollow with exhaustion, peering into incubators where their babies are fighting a battle they did not choose. It is a stark realization: in Delhi, our children are not just born into a polluted world; they are being shaped by it in the womb. The Silent Emergency in the Womb: We often talk about air pollution as a "winter menace" or a "respiratory irritant." But standing here with my baby, I see it for what it truly is: an obstetric emergency. Recent reports and medical experts confirm what is unfolding before my eyes—air pollutants are crossing the placental barrier, impacting foetal development in real-time. The statistics are no longer just numbers on a page; they are the tiny faces I see in the nursery. Studies indicate a 70 per cent increase in the chance of premature birth when pregnant women are exposed to high levels of air pollution, with North India faring the worst.

These are babies born before their lungs are fully developed, forcing them into longer, agonizing stays in the nursery just to survive. We are seeing a generation entering the world with a deficit, their biological start compromised by the very air their mothers breathed. A Legacy of Vulnerability: The damage does not stop at birth. The medical consensus is chilling: exposure to fine particulate matter (PM2.5) during pregnancy is linked to low birth weight and restricted growth. These are not temporary setbacks. Low birth weight is a harbinger for a lifetime of health challenges, from reduced lung function to an increased risk of chronic diseases later in life. As a new father, this terrifies me. We did everything right—we followed the diet charts, we attended the check-ups, we took the vitamins.

But how do we protect our children from the air? We cannot ask our wives to stop breathing. The "gas chamber" of Delhi is not just an outdoor hazard; it is infiltrating our biology. We are witnessing a slow-motion health catastrophe where the most vulnerable—the unborn and the newborn—are paying the highest price. A Demand for Accountability: This is not a plea for sympathy; it is a demand for a radical shift in how we handle this crisis. We can no longer treat air pollution as a seasonal inconvenience to be managed with "odd-even" schemes or temporary construction bans. We need a Health Action Plan that treats this as the medical emergency it is. First, we must demand accountability from our healthcare systems. Just as blood pressure and sugar levels are recorded, air quality exposure data should be integrated into prenatal and patient medical records.

Doctors need to treat respiratory distress in newborns not just as a clinical symptom, but as a direct result of environmental toxicity. Second, we need immediate, strictly enforced Low Emission Zones (LEZs) around hospitals and schools. It is unconscionable that the very places where life begins and thrives are engulfed in idling exhaust and road dust. Our hospitals should be sanctuaries of clean air, not islands in a sea of smog. A Father's Promise: They say a parent's instinct is to protect. Right now, holding my child, I feel a fierce resolve rising above the helplessness. We, the parents of India, are done waiting for "better AQI days" that never come. We are done listening to politicians make vague promises while our children struggle to breathe.

We demand city-specific clean air action plans that are executed, not just announced. We demand a future where "survival" does not depend on how many air purifiers you can afford. To the policymakers, I say this: Do not come to us for votes if you cannot promise our children the basic right to breathe. To my fellow parents, I say: Wake up. This fight is for their survival. I look at my newborn, and I make a promise: I will not be silent. I will fight for your blue skies. Because if I don't fight for your breath, who will?

The High Court of Himachal Pradesh has quashed the Director of Health Services (DHS)' order revoking the appointment of a staff nurse hired three years ago.

The DHS' order stated that she was not eligible to be considered for appointment, as the recruitment was for the 2011 batch. On the other hand, Nurse Kajal Mehra graduated in 2014. She was recruited on a contract basis in the OBC-BPL category.

The Selection Committee, after taking note of her educational qualification certificates, recommended her name for appointment to the post of staff nurse, vide office

order dated March 16, 2022. She joined the Department, and after two

years, a complaint was lodged with the Vigilance Department alleging that Mehra had been wrongly appointed to a post advertised for the 2011 batch.

Initially, she was not given any opportunity, and her appointment letter was withdrawn. After the High Court intervened, the health department served a show-cause notice on her and, following due process,

2024. She approached the High Court again and submitted that there was no "misrepresentation or fraud" on her part and that the Selection Committee, fully aware that she had acquired the requisite qualification for the post in 2014, recommended her name for appointment.

After hearing arguments, Justice Sandeep Sharma

observed, "No doubt, as per the procedure posts notified for a particular batch can be filled up from the candidates of that batch only, meaning thereby if posts were advertised for the 2011 batch, candidates, who had acquired the requisite qualification for the post in question till that date, only could have been considered."
