



PM Modi to Start Working from New Office on January 14 Makar Sankranti

(Gns).

Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to move into a new office on Makar Sankranti, January 14, shifting the Prime Minister's Office from South Block to the newly built 'Seva Teerth' complex under the Central Vista Redevelopment Project, a move that ends the PMO's continuous presence in South Block since 1947 and reshapes the core of India's administrative zone.

The change comes as part of a larger redesign of central government spaces in New Delhi, with South and North Blocks set to be turned into a public museum named 'Yuge Yugeen Bharat Sangrahalya', reflecting a move towards public access while key decision-making offices

relocate to a modern zone known as the Executive Enclave.

The 'Seva Teerth' complex has been planned to bring together the Prime Minister's Office, the Cabinet Secretariat and the National Security Council Secretariat, with each institution placed in its own separate building to streamline operations while keeping functions distinct, and the name underlines a theme of duty and public 'service' (seva) at the heart of its design.

The building that will now host the PMO is called 'Seva Teerth-1' and includes upgraded work areas along with large ceremonial halls, while 'Seva Teerth 2' already houses the Cabinet Secretariat after a shift in September

last year and 'Seva Teerth-3' has been planned to accommodate the office of the National Security Advisor under the same secure campus.

Cost, scale and layout of the Seva Teerth PMO complex

The entire Executive Enclave, including 'Seva Teerth', is being constructed by Larsen & Toubro at a cost of Rs 1,189 crore and covers 2,26,203 sq ft, and a separate official residence for the Prime Minister, temporarily labelled "Executive Enclave Part 2", is also rising nearby as part of the same redevelopment cluster.

The transformation of South and North Blocks into 'Yuge Yugeen Bharat Sangrahalya' is moving forward after an agreement signed on December 19, 2024, with France's Museum

bringing foreign expertise into how the former government offices will be curated for visitors.

The shift to 'Seva Teerth' aligns with Prime Minister Modi's stated effort to reduce symbols of colonial rule in central Delhi, the same approach that saw Rajpath renamed Kartavya Path, and the new location and naming pattern underscore a preference for terms linked to duty, responsibility and public service within the Central Vista Redevelopment Project.

Alongside the Executive Enclave, the Union government is building a series of Common Central Secretariat buildings to

gather ministries that are now scattered across Delhi into fewer, purpose-built structures, and Kartavya Bhawan, inaugurated in August last year, already hosts several ministries as part of that administrative consolidation plan.

With the PMO moving into 'Seva Teerth-1', the Cabinet Secretariat settled in 'Seva Teerth 2', and the National Security Council Secretariat expected in 'Seva Teerth-3', the Central Vista Redevelopment Project advances another stage, reshaping where top decisions are taken while older colonial-era offices prepare for a new role as 'Yuge Yugeen Bharat Sangrahalya'.

Shah added that development and science are not against heritage; both are the needs of the nation's people, and both can move forward together. The Minister noted there

has been unprecedented growth in the field of biotechnology in over the past 11 years.

"We have achieved significant success in the bio sector and there is immense potential in this area," Shah said.

He noted in 2014, India's bio-economy was worth USD 10 billion, and by the end of the financial year 2024, it had grown to USD 166 billion.

Shah added that a 17-fold growth in just 10 years shows that India's youth and entrepreneurs can achieve great success in the bio-economy sector, provided they receive support from the government and the necessary infrastructure.

Released annually by the Finance Ministry, the survey acts as a bridge between economic data and budgetary decisions.

The Economic Survey is the government's annual assessment of India's economic performance. Prepared by the Finance Ministry, it reviews how the economy has fared over the previous year and highlights trends that may influence policy decisions in the upcoming Union

Budget. Who prepares the Economic Survey?

The survey is compiled by the Department of Economic Affairs and overseen by the Chief Economic Advisor.

Inputs are drawn from multiple government departments, research institutions and global agencies before the final document is approved.

Why is the Economic Survey released before the Union Budget? The survey sets the economic context for the

Budget. It outlines growth trends, fiscal pressures and sector-wise performance, helping policymakers decide where spending or reforms may be needed.

What kind of information does the Survey include?

The report covers macroeconomic indicators such as GDP growth, inflation, fiscal deficit and revenue trends. It also examines how sectors like agriculture, industry and services have performed.

Beyond this, the survey looks at employment, education, healthcare, infrastructure, social welfare schemes and environmental challenges. Global economic factors that could affect India's outlook are also analysed.

Trump's Global Aggression Escalates

Post his success in Venezuela, President Donald Trump assumes that the US has the capacity to intervene anywhere it desires, irrespective of a nation being a friend or foe, and can alter global and regional geopolitical dynamics at will. Few nations criticized the US action in Venezuela, though it violated international law. Venezuela was a success because its corrupt military leadership was possibly bought over by the CIA. It may not happen every time. Venezuela remains far from stable. Deicy Rodriguez, as acting President, is attempting to balance ever increasing demands and threats from Trump against pulls and pressures from various anti-US factions within.

She faces internal and external challenges and instead of supporting the transition in leadership, Trump is countering with additional demands. Rather than wait for Venezuela to stabilize, Trump has begun planning his next misadventure, hoping it would be as easy as Venezuela. He has begun claiming that Greenland is essential for security of the US and hence must form part of it. Defending his stance he has stated that if the US does not occupy it, Russia and China would do so soon. He has also issued threats of military intervention against Columbia, Cuba, Mexico and Iran.

Earlier he had demanded that Canada must be a part of the US, souring ties. For Trump, global bodies, rules-based order, and international law including respecting sovereignty of nations, mean nothing. His tariff wars and inflated ego have pushed his close allies away. His claims of having resolved multiple conflicts hence entitling him to the Nobel Peace Prize, have been contested by many, including India. After failing to end conflicts, Trump has shifted track to engaging militarily with nations which are of concern to the US, hoping this would garner him the award, as some of these nations are dictatorships with poor human rights record, while a majority export drugs to the West.

Trump's threats on Greenland will break the one organization that has bound Europe and the US for decades, NATO. It was NATO which stood with the US in Afghanistan. On the contrary, Trump claims that NATO is nothing without the US. He mentioned, "Russia and China have zero fear of NATO without the US." Trump and his advisors continue threatening military action on Greenland. It is also possible that his threat of controlling Greenland is to rattle Europe which has been standing in the way of him resolving the Ukraine war and assuring himself of the Nobel award. Trump's pushing Ukraine to accept his proposals are thwarted by Europe which backs President Zelensky's views. European leaders backed Trump's actions in Venezuela while criticizing his claims on Greenland, as it is closer home.

Europe is also considering opening direct lines of communication with Russia to end the conflict by nominating a special envoy, a channel which would be more appealing to Moscow as it is Europe that is far more affected than the US. This is bound to rattle Trump. Nations in the Americas now being threatened by Trump would have learned lessons from Venezuela and begin taking precautions. While Columbia has backed down and its President Gustavo Petro has spoken to Trump, others continue to defy. A failure as happened during Operation Eagle Claw, which was launched by Jimmy Carter to rescue US diplomats held hostage in Iran, would force Trump onto the defensive. In pursuit of Trump's military interventions, the UN is being discarded.

The UN Secretary General termed the attack on Venezuela as a 'dangerous precedent.' Marc Rubio stated defiantly "I don't care what the UN says." The US permanent representative to the UN stated in his briefing to the UNSC, "We are not occupying a country." This contrasts with what Trump said, "we will run Venezuela." The intent is evident, Trump will do what he desires, opening doors for other nations to follow suit. Trump's insistence on adhering to the Monroe doctrine which implies dominating the Americas and ensuring governments in this region do Washington's bidding may not be easily implementable. The US's multiple attempts to have Cuban leader Fidel Castro assassinated failed, and he ultimately died of natural causes, aged 90, in 2016. Cuba continues to defy the US.

Mexico has refused to fall into the US trap, though Trump threatens to deploy US troops on Mexican soil to target drug cartels. Iran is the only nation not in the Americas where Trump is threatening to intervene. This is for two reasons. Firstly, the failed Operation Eagle Claw remains a blot on the US military and secondly its ability to threaten Israel. Iran is currently in the throes of an internal uprising, which the US and Israel have been inciting, directly and indirectly. The US had bombed Iran alongside Israel recently. It could repeat this. However, targeting its leadership with boots on the ground is another story. Its only hope is that the internal uprising forces the leadership to yield power, something possible but still some distance away.

The Iranian leadership has faced similar uprisings earlier and pulled through, though for different reasons. Will it survive the present is to be seen. Trump's intent appears to be to align with other major powers and divide the world into spheres of influence and control. Under this, Trump would control the Americas and Europe, China would dominate South and South East Asia, while Russia would manage Central Asia. It is possibly with this mind that Trump recently stated, "He (Xi) considers it (Taiwan) to be a part of China, and that's up to him what he's going to be doing," adding he would be unhappy if it did (attack and occupy Taiwan). In addition, Trump has approved the bill, 'Sanctioning Russia Act of 2025,' which gives him sweeping powers of enhancing tariffs up to 500 per cent on nations which procure Russian oil.

The nations he intends to target are China, India and Brazil, all members of BRICS, an organization which he visualizes as a threat since they seek to bypass the US dollar in global trade. India is in the crosshairs because it refuses to bend to Trump's demands and is the only nation whose economy has been growing despite his sanctions. Further the Indian leadership is unwilling to assuage Trump's ego. How far Trump will be able to go with his military intervention threats is to be seen. India must continue to hold firm, setting an example for others.

Gandhinagar, 13 January 2026: Union Home Minister Shri Amit Shah laid the foundation stone of Gujarat's first state-of-the-art Bio-Containment Facility "Bio Safety Level-4" lab as well as the "Animal Bio-Safety Level" facility in Gandhinagar, in the presence of Chief Minister Shri Bhupendra Patel. On this occasion, Minister for Science and Technology Shri Arjun Modhwadia was also present.

During this ceremony, the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, granted a Letter of Intent (LoI) to the Gujarat Science and Technology Department to designate the "Bio Safety Level-4" facility of the Gujarat Biotechnology Research Centre (GBRC) as the 'National Centre for High Containment Pathogen Research Facility' under the Government of India's "BioE3 Policy".

Union Home Minister stated that a new era has begun from Gujarat in the development of India's health security and bio-safety sector. After Pune, this is only the second such high-level lab in the country; however, due to the special initiative of the state government, this will become the country's first state government-operated BSL-4 lab, to be constructed at a cost of Rs. 362 crore. In the future, this lab will prove to be India's impregnable security shield and a strong fortress of bio-facilities to combat deadly viruses.

Reiterating Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's vision that 'science and technology should be the foundation pillar of national development', he said that this international-standard lab will open many avenues of opportunity for researchers and youth.

Especially, this lab will accelerate the "One Health Mission" initiated by the Prime Minister to prevent diseases transmitted from animals to humans. In showing resilience against recent challenges such as Chandipura and Lumpy Skin Disease experienced by Gujarat, such a research-based permanent security arrangement was essential.

Presenting figures reflecting the revolutionary transformation in India's biotechnology sector, he

said that unprecedented progress has been made in the last 11 years. India's bio-economy, which stood at 10 billion dollars in 2014, has grown to over 166 billion dollars by 2024. Considering research as the 'soul of innovation', due to the infrastructural facilities provided by the central government, Indian scientists today are conducting world-class research in a highly secure environment.

Highlighting the growth in the startup and investment sectors, he said that in 2014 there were fewer than 500 startups in this field, which have now grown to more than 10,000. Similarly, the number of incubators has increased from 6 to 95, and incubation space has expanded from 60,000 square feet to 9 lakh square feet. Notably, private investment funding has increased from Rs. 10 crore to Rs. 7,000 crore, and the number of patent filings has risen from 125 to over 1,300, indicating that India's youth are now becoming 'job givers' rather than 'job seekers'. He stated that under the Government of India's "BioE3 Policy", there is a resolve to take the country to greater heights in the biotechnology sector. India today is indigenously manufacturing vaccines for serious diseases such as Corona and cervical cancer.

He called upon students and researchers, stating that the responsibility of ensuring India's health security now rests on their shoulders. This lab will be capable of bringing about many positive transformations in the health sector in the coming times.

He stated that under the leadership of the Prime Minister, India today is moving forward by carrying both 'development' and 'heritage' together. During the Corona period, Indian scientists developed vaccines in a short time, safeguarding 140 crore citizens and helping the world, based on the approach of making science and technology the foundation pillar of national development. With this lab, Indian scientists will no longer need to depend on foreign countries for sample testing, thereby fulfilling the resolve of 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' in the health sector.

He expressed confidence that by 2027, India will also be among the world's leading nations in the semiconductor and biotechnology sectors.

He expressed concern over the 'silent disaster' (AMR) arising from the misuse of antibiotics and urged students and researchers to protect the next generation through research. He called upon students studying in the biotech sector to make maximum use of national facilities to develop pharmaceutical formulations and vaccines beneficial to human life and to achieve the goal of 'Viksit Bharat' by 2047. This facility will emerge as a protective shield not only for Gujarat but for the entire country.



For a country that prides itself on treating cricket as both sport and soft power, India is surprisingly careless when it comes to separating the two. The recent controversy over Bangladeshi cricketer Mustafizur Rahaman's exclusion from the Kolkata Knight Riders IPL franchise should have been a routine sporting decision. Instead, it became a noisy referendum on patriotism, identity, and national loyalty. That slippage matters more than it appears. At the heart of the debate lies a simple but vital distinction. A national team represents a state.

A franchise team represents a city, a brand, and a business model. When a country chooses to boycott another nation's team after war, terror, or diplomatic breakdown, it is making a symbolic statement about state behaviour. But when

a privately owned franchise sidelines a foreign player because of political pressure, it crosses into murkier territory. It turns an individual professional into a stand-in for an entire nation's politics. This is not an argument for ignoring real concerns about Bangladesh. India has legitimate anxieties about minority safety, hostile political rhetoric, and Dhaka's recent strategic signalling. These are serious issues that deserve firm diplomatic engagement.

But they are not advanced by targeting sportspersons who have no role in policy, power, or provocation. If anything, such gestures weaken

India's position by making it appear impulsive rather than principled. Franchise cricket has always been an experiment in coexistence. Players from rival nations share dressing rooms, celebrate each other's milestones, and perform for crowds that cheer skill over nationality. This has never diluted national interest; it has strengthened India's image as a confident, open sporting culture. Undermining that space for political optics is a strategic self-goal. The reaction to the franchise decision also revealed an uncomfortable trend: the ease with which sport is now being weaponised for identity politics. When business deci-

ments are so deeply rooted in restraint, communication, and an understanding that not every provocation deserves a megaphone. There is a deeper cost to all this. When every bilateral tension spills onto the cricket field, sport loses its unique role as a neutral meeting ground. It becomes another arena of grievance, another stage for point-scoring.

Encounter Breaks Out In Jammu And Kashmir's Kathua As Security Forces Launch Anti-Terror Operation

(Gns). Security forces in Jammu and Kashmir initiated an anti-terror operation in the Billawar area of Kathua district after terrorists, suspected to be from the Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) group, opened fire on a patrolling team; the operation involves Army, Jammu and Kashmir Police, and paramilitary forces. The encounter, which began in the Najote forest area, is ongoing and aims to neutralize the terrorists while ensuring civilian safety, and this is the second major operation in Kathua district within a week.

The exchange of fire took place during a cordon-and-search operation launched by the forces following inputs about the presence of Pakistan-based Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) terrorists in the region.

According to reports, the encounter began in the Najote forest area of

Billawar, about 10 kilometres from Kamadh Nallah in the Kahog forest belt. Officials said the terrorists

Officials said that a few rounds of gunfire were exchanged, and the forces

Preliminary reports suggest that the terrorists involved are affiliated with the Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) group, which has been active along the Jammu border region in recent months. Security agencies believe the militants may have crossed into Indian territory recently and were planning to target local security installations.

This is the second major operation in Kathua district within a week. Earlier, security forces had conducted a search in the same region after receiving intelligence about the movement of two to three armed militants.

Officials confirmed that the operation would continue until all threats are eliminated. "The area has been cordoned off, and our troops are working carefully to ensure the terrorists are neutralised," a senior police officer said.
